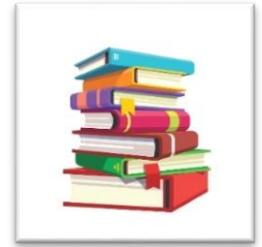


# Year 2 Authors, Poets and Stories

**14 June 1923 - 22 May 2019**

**Born:** Anna Judith Gertrud Helene Kerr

**Home Town:** Berlin, Germany

### **Famous Books:**

The Mog Series, The Tiger Who Came To Tea, When Hitler Stole Pink Rabbit (semi-autobiographical)

### **Interesting Facts:**

- She was the daughter of [Alfred Kerr](#) (1867–1948), a [theatre critic](#), and [Julia Kerr](#) (born Julia Anna Franziska Weismann; 1898–1965), a composer.
- She fled Nazi persecution with her family in 1933, escaping to Switzerland.
- During WWII, she worked for the Red Cross, attending wounded soldiers.
- She married screenwriter [Nigel "Tom" Kneale](#), in the BBC canteen. He wrote the cult TV science-fiction serial [The Quatermass Experiment](#)



## Brian Moses
