Where is the Lake District?	The Lake District is in the northwest of England in the county of Cumbria.
What is the physical geography of the Lake District like?	The physical geography of the Lake District can include hills, mountains, forests, valleys, rivers, tarns and lakes. It can also include the water cycle.
What is the human geography of the Lake District like?	The human geography of the Lake District can in- clude types of settlement e.g. towns and villages, how the land is used e.g. farming and how the dis- trict makes money e.g. tourism.
What do we mean by referring to the Lake District as a National Park?	A National Park is a protected area because of wild- life, beautiful countryside or cultural heritage. The villages, towns and farms are also protected. National Parks, such as the Lake District National Park, welcome visitors so that everyone can enjoy these areas of natural beauty.
