Aim	Outcome
Progress in Reading and Writing	Due to C-19 (2019-21) pupil progress disrupted – interventions in place to enhance learning.
Progress in Mathematics	Worsening of results since last year. As a result, mastery will be embedded across the school, to ensure we meet the aim.
Phonics	100% Y2 passed their phonics test in Nov 2020. Our aim is for 100% of this year's Y2 in Nov 21 will also pass.
Other	Focus on maintaining and improving pupil well-being, using the new PSHE Association and Coram resources and an extra PE session for all during the week.
