Our school day

The school gates open at 8:45am for pupils to arrive.

- School starts – 9:00am
- Break – 10:15am – 10:30am
- Lunchtime for EYFS/KS1 – 11:50am – 1:00pm
- Lunchtime for KS2 – 12:00noon – 1:00pm
- Classes gather for prayer – 3:25pm
- Home time – 3:30pm

Wraparound care


Breakfast Club:

We run a breakfast club from 7:45am where children can choose from a range of food options to start their day. The cost is £3 per session or £1.50 from 8:30am.

After School Child Care:

We offer a range of after school clubs that finish at 5pm or 4pm on a Friday, these can be found on our website or by contacting the school office.

Little Wrens (nursery) finish at 3pm, however if they have older siblings and you would like them to remain in school until 3:30pm this can be arranged for a small fee of £1.50. Breakfast and after school clubs are open to nursery children and can be accessed through funded hours or private payments.



Our school uniform

The school uniform can be purchased from either our school uniform supplier, Etika Uniforms, in any supermarket or our pre-loved uniform bank for the uniform supplies.


Our uniform:

- Black shoes (not trainers).


PE uniform:





Apply for a place at St. Mary's


