Jubilee Year 2024

The Holy Year starts with the opening of the Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica. A Jubilee Year is a special time in the Catholic Church for **forgiveness** and **reconciliation**. The first Jubilee was declared by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300. Over time, the interval between Jubilees has changed, but Pope Saint Paul II set the current 25-year interval in the 1500s. The 2025 Jubilee, titled "Spes Non Confudit" meaning "Hope Does Not Disappoint," will be a year of hope and trust, emphasising God's mercy and forgiveness.

As we prepare for the Jubilee, let's embrace the message of hope and become 'Pilgrims of Hope.' This Holy Year is an opportunity to renew our faith, strengthen our community, and focus on the future with trust and confidence. Children will be learning about the Jubilee Year as part of whole school Candle Times, class prayer and at Mass.
