As a school we are very fortunate to have parents that completely understand and support the importance of attendance.

Whilst our attendance is very good overall, I just want to reiterate the importance of attendance and every day , and minute counting!

We often see patterns from our attendance data showing the same children arriving late. Every minute counts so can we make a big effort to get our children to school before **9am**, ready to start the lessons. Anyone arriving after the **9am** register is marked late. Fines FOR BEING LATE CAN ALSO OCCUR.

Holidays during term time WILL NOT be authorised, and the fine for holidays is increasing to £80 per child, per adult.

Late Arrivals

Parents, a polite reminder to please make sure your child arrives to school in good time for register. Children can arrive from 8.45am when there is an adult in the classroom and then be in, ready for register for 9am.

We are seeing an increase in late registrations, heightened anxieties and children arriving without having breakfast.. Unfortunately, repeated late marks can also result in a fine from the authority.

The impact on the rest of the day for some children is huge, and unfortunately it seems to be these children that are often late. It also impacts on staff.

Individual messages and meetings will need to take place with myself and the attendance team if we do not see improvement.
