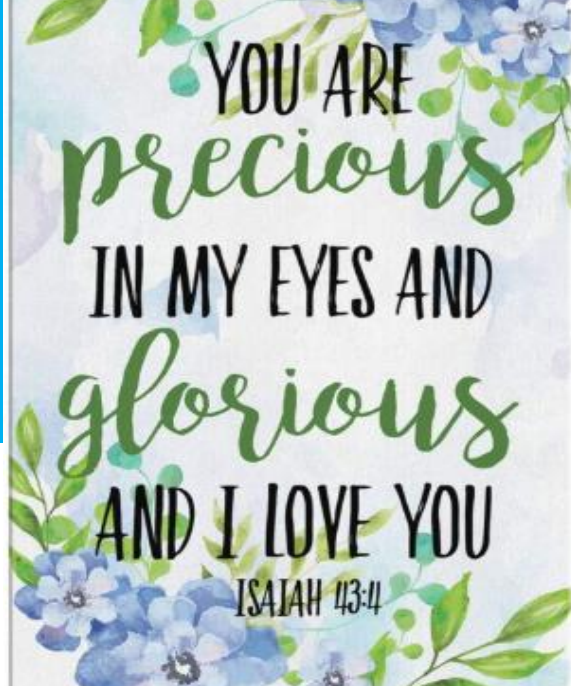
Wren class adventures

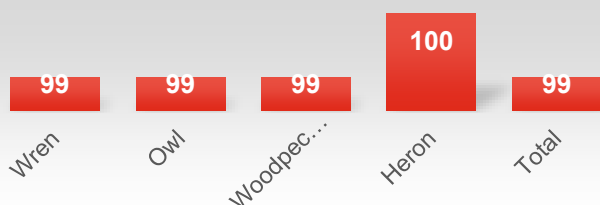
