Key Learning

Living things can be grouped (classified) in different ways according to their features. Classification keys can be used to identify and name living things.

Living things live in a habitat which provides an environment to which they are suited. These environments may change naturally e.g. through flooding, fire, earthquakes etc. Humans also cause the environment to change. This can be in a good way or in a bad. These environments also change with the seasons; different living things can be found in a habitat at different times of the year.
