Safeguarding

Mobile phones in school

Children who travel independently are permitted to bring mobile phones to school, on condition that they hand them in at the office before the start of school and collect them at the end of the day. They may not use their phones on site and they are not permitted to take photographs at school or to make recordings.

If your child attends an after school club, they should collect their phone from the office and give it to the club leader for safekeeping.

Smart Watches

Children may not bring smart watches to school for safeguarding reasons. Fitness trackers which simply measure exercise are fine, provided they do not have the facility to make recording or to take images.

First Holy Communion celebration

There is a whole school Mass at 9.10am to which parents are invited.

Year 3 children come to school and change into their First Holy Communion clothes before whole school Mass; children in Year 3 who haven't made their First Holy Communion may wear party/ home clothes instead and they are included in the celebration.

The six children in Year 4 who made or will make their First Holy Communion this year may bring their communion clothes and join with Year 3.

After Mass, one class will go into the small hall for their refreshments while the other class goes outside for photos, and then they swap.

Afterwards, children change back into their uniform for normal lessons.

All parents are invited to the Mass. Parents of First Holy Communicants may attend the breakfast and take photos.
