The deadline for Reception admissions 2023 is this Sunday- 15th January and the local authority advises that on-time applications are made for all ageappropriate children – even without the supporting documents. These can follow afterwards, unless an application is being made under Medical and Social criteria – these documents must be provided by the application deadline.

The Admissions Team's number is 020 8313 4044 and the line is open 10.00-16.00 weekdays for parents. Team members can give individual advice about home to school distances, how the system works and making realistic preferences.

Free School Meals

As you may be aware, the government gives additional funding to schools for looked after children, children who have been adopted from care and children who are in receipt of free school meals or have been in previous years. This funding is called the Pupil Premium Grant and it is used to support positive outcomes for children.

At St Mary's, we are careful to ensure that the money is spent wisely and that the children benefit directly from the additional funding. In the past year, the money has been spent on the following:

Small group and 1:1 tuition Music tuition taking place in school for small groups and individual children Subsidising school trips, visits by theatre groups and the Year 6 residential visit Subsidising uniform and clothing for residential visits Extra-curricular activities

All children who qualify for Pupil Premium funding can have one funded extracurricular activity per term, a 15-minute peripatetic music lesson each week, as well as subsidised trips and visits. Eligible families receive vouchers from the local authority's Household Support fund to assist them with food during holiday periods.

Your child may be eligible for pupil premium funding if you receive any of the following benefits:

Income support

Income based Jobseekers Allowance Income-related Employment and Support Allowance Child Tax Credit (providing you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit), with a gross annual household income of no more than £16,190 (as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs-HMRC) Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit Support under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment received for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit) Universal Credit, with a net annual household income of £7,400 or less (after tax and not including any other benefits you receive).

Please note that Pupil Premium Funding is meanstested, and is separate from the governments Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme (UIFSM). UIFSM entitles all pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 to have free school meals, regardless of parents' circumstances.
