#### Survey working party

You may remember that I conducted a survey of parents in July and at that time, asked for parent volunteers to form a 'task and finish' group to consider the outcomes. The first meeting took place on Tuesday with parents from Years 2, 3 and 4 in attendance.

During the meeting, we looked at responses and considered two areas in particular:

The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year.

The school lets me know how my child is doing.

There was a wide-ranging discussion about what is already in place and ways in which communication can be sharpened. I will share notes with you once I have discussed them with the staff.
