COVID-19 update

If your child has any of the main COVID-19 symptoms (a high temperature, a new continuous cough, or a loss or change to sense of smell or taste), they should not attend school and should stay at home until you are certain they do not have COVID.

In line with the reduced self-isolation approach which came into effect on 17 January, anyone who tests positive will be able to leave self-isolation 5 days after the date of their initial positive test if they receive a negative LFD results on day 6.

Here is the most recent DfE guidance:

Education and childcare settings are not expected to trace contacts of a positive case as this will remain the responsibility of NHS Test and Trace. From Tuesday 11 January, contact tracing is triggered once a positive LFD test is reported.

Students should be strongly encouraged to test twice weekly at home and to report all results to NHS Test and Trace.

Anyone with a positive LFD test result should self-isolate and follow self-isolation guidance. Information on the new arrangements can be found in the <u>stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed COVID-19 infection.</u>

This illustrates how the isolation period is calculated.

Day 0: When you develop symptoms or have a positive test

Day 5: First lateral flow test

Day 6: Second lateral flow test. If both Day 5 & 6 are negative you can leave self-isolation - provided you do not have COVID symptoms at this point

Birthday books
