Industrial action Wednesday 1st February

As you are aware, the NEU voted to take industrial action with the first strike day being Wednesday 1 February. While employees are not required to tell their employers whether they intend to take action, members of the NEU at St Mary's have informed me that they will strike on 1 February and thus, the school will be partially closed.

Superkids and school clubs e.g Hockey and Irish Dancing clubs will remain open. Parents of children in the affected classes are therefore asked to make alternative arrangements for 1 February.

If your child's class is not affected by strike action, they are expected to attend school as normal.

The NEU has called for three further days on industrial action on Thursday 02 March 2023, Wednesday 15 March 2023 and Thursday 16 March 2023 and I will write to you nearer these dates to let you know if St Mary's is affected.

Inspirational Person for next week - Anne Frank

On January 27th it is Holocaust Memorial Day and often on this day people write a letter to Anne Frank. Annelies Marie "Anne" Frank was a Germanborn Jewish girl who kept a diary in which she documented life in hiding under Nazi persecution during World War II. She is a celebrated diarist who described everyday life from her family hiding place in an Amsterdam attic. Anne kept a diary which he father's secretary found and kept safe after her family's hiding place was discovered. Only Anne's father survived World War II and when he returned to his home town his secretary gave him Anne's diary which was published in 1947 and has become one of the most famous diaries ever published and was written when she was just a teenager.

Keeping Children Safe: Discord

Discord is popular with gamers and has grown to a full social network with over 140 million active users. The website- Internet Matters- explains the following:

The platform is not suitable for young children The minimum age requirement is 13 years and up. However, Discord updated its age rating to 17+ at Apple's request. Their website states they want to "help ensure minors are not exposed to content inappropriate for them." Because users may share images on text channels or engage in voice chat, young users run the risk of exposure to inappropriate content or language.

Some Discord servers contain adult content and are labelled as only accessible to those over 18 years old. Anyone that opens the channel sees a warning message that lets them know that it might contain graphic content and asks them to confirm they are over 18.

Most conversations are private and allow live video and location tracking

The conversations in Discord are private to the group, so it's less open and visible than other social networks. Along with this, you can type, talk, listen and watch live videos of other users. There is also a 'Nearby' feature that allows you to add friends who have the location features on their device turned on that are physically nearby.
