Breck Foundation workshops

Safer Internet Day is on the 8th February and the theme this year is 'All fun and games? Exploring respect and relationships online'. In conjunction with this, Miss Boyce has arranged for a speaker from the Breck Foundation to come into school and speak with the children around this topic.

The Breck Foundation is a self-funded charity set up by Lorin LaFave, in memory of her son Breck who lost his life to an online groomer through a gaming relationship. Since then, Lorin has made numerous TV and radio appearances to raise awareness of online grooming and promote digital resilience. They use Breck's story to educate young people, teachers, support staff and parents about the risks of online grooming to empower young people to make better choices when interacting online, leading to safer outcomes. Entrance and exit from Monday

From Monday, there will be a change to the arrangements at the beginning and end of the school day. At present, everyone comes in through the pedestrian gate and exits through the car park gate. From next week, the car park gate will be closed and entrance and exit will be through the pedestrian gate only.

We have had to make this change due to ongoing complaints and the threat of further action from a neighbour who objects to our families walking outside his property.

We will trial it for a week and if it doesn't work, we shall revert.

Children's Mass at St Edmund's

Did you know that each Sunday at 9.30 am we have a Mass in the Hall for families with young children. This is a relaxed and friendly Mass which the families who attend seem to enjoy - they certainly come back to it, and we now have a lovely team of children to ring the bell and to carry the cross and to assist with the readings. New families are most welcome to come and join us.

COVID-19 update

If your child has any of the main COVID-19 symptoms (a high temperature, a new continuous cough, or a loss or change to sense of smell or taste), they should not attend school and should stay at home until you are certain they do not have COVID.

In line with the reduced self-isolation approach which came into effect on 17 January, anyone who tests positive will be able to leave self-isolation 5 days after the date of their initial positive test if they receive a negative LFD results on day 6.

Here is the most recent DfE guidance:

Students should be strongly encouraged to test twice weekly at home and to report all results to NHS Test and Trace.

Anyone with a positive LFD test result should self-isolate and follow self-isolation guidance. Information on the new arrangements can be found in the <u>stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed COVID-19 infection</u>.

This illustrates how the isolation period is calculated.

Day 0: When you develop symptoms or have a positive test

Day 5: First lateral flow test

Day 6: Second lateral flow test. If both Day 5 & 6 are negative you can leave self-isolation - provided you do not have COVID symptoms at this point

Birthday books
