## Attendance matters

There is a strong link between good school attendance and positive outcomes for children. Children who come to school regularly tend to have better academic outcomes, stronger friendships and greater resilience.

Understandably, there are times when children are too unwell to attend and this half term, many have been affected by a flu-like virus and chickenpox. This link provides guidance on common childhood illnesses, including whether or not a child should come to school.

# Infection Control in Schools

If your child has been prescribed antibiotics but does not have a temperature, they can come to school and we can administer medication for them- they do not have to complete the course before they return. All you need to do is to supply the antibiotics in a clearly-labelled bottle and to fill in a brief form at the office.

Nationally, school attendance below 90% is deemed as 'persistent absence' and at 50% or below is categorised as 'severely absent'. I am concerned that at this point in the year, 33 of our children are 'persistent absentees'. For some of these children, there is an absence almost every week. For others, their late arrival (i.e. after 9am), means that they have to be registered as missing the entire morning session.

So, how is persistent absenc calculated?

Persistent absence thresholds by half term				
(10% of possible attendances)				
Autumn 1	3 days absent			
Autumn 2	7 days absent			
Spring 1	10 days absent			
Spring 2	13 days absent			
Summer 1	16 days absent			
Summer 2	19 days absent			

If a child is persistently absent and there are no extenuating circumstances, I have a duty to involve the Educational Welfare Service (EWO) and it could result in a fine. Equally, if children are taken out of school for holidays in term time, it is referred to the EWO service and may result in a penalty notice.

In short, we want children to be in school so they can access their full curriculum, establish good routines and enjoy time with their peers. We appreciate your support in achieving this.
