Literacy

During our literacy lessons we will continue to reinforce the use of phonics to support our spelling and in our Little Wandle reading sessions, we will continue to develop comprehension skills. We will focus on story writing based on the themes of Remembrance Day and Bonfire Night. Our focus text for this half term will be Owl babies. During this term we really want to focus on sentence structure and using a range of exciting vocabulary. When reading with your child, we would especially request that you ask questions (often these are at the back of the book) and predict what happens next. This is to increase their comprehension skills.



Mathematics

Number: We are continuing to add and subtract numbers within 100 using different methods such as number lines and drawing out base 10. This will be an arithmetic focus to ensure fluency when adding and subtracting. Children are encouraged to use their knowledge of number bonds to support them to solve problems.



Religious Education

Our topic this half term will be **Mysteries.** We are talking about the Trinity and how the Holy Spirit can guide us. We would like the children to learn The Glory Be. We will also discuss Advent and the Christmas story.

RSE

In our RSE lessons we will be thinking about our emotional wellbeing and feelings especially anger. Also we will begin to learn about the cycle of life. We will continue to learn about special, notable people and how they contribute or have contributed to our society.



Science

We will continue our unit of study on living things and their habitats. We will learn how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other We will also learn about food chains and the relationship between prey and predator.

Other Curriculum Areas

P.E.: We will continue to have PE on Tuesdays and Thursdays. This half term Year 2 will concentrate on yoga and outdoor games. Please make sure the children have a dark plain tracksuit and trainers. Girls need to have a pair of white socks in their PE bags as they are unable to wear tights during PE lessons. Please ensure these are all named.

Computing: We will focus on all aspects of coding using Purple Mash. The children will create a simple program that achieves a specific purpose and will also try to identify and correct some errors known as 'debugging'.

Geography: We will be learning to name and locate the four countries of the UK. We will use directional language (points of a compass) to follow a route and draw simple maps for Father Christmas to use to find our homes!

Art and Design: We are using poppies as a focus for our art work and especially looking at Monet's poppy paintings. We will also develop skills through various Christmas activities.

Music: This term our work is based around the Christmas production. Children will need to learn the songs for our Nativity.

Behaviour in Year 2

In Year 2 positive praise and reinforcement is used by both class teachers. The children are rewarded for good behavior and hard work through stickers and their class bear. Each Year 2 class has a class bear which gets to go home with a child for the weekend.

We also encourage the children to show good pieces of work to the adjacent class teacher. On the rare occasion that a child does not make the right choice they will be given a verbal warning from their class teacher. If this type of behavior persists then they will be sent next door to the adjacent class teacher for a short period of time to complete their work.
