Religious Education

We will be following 'The Way, the Truth and the Life' scheme and our next topic is 'Called to Change'. We look at Jesus's role as a teacher and the power of forgiveness and reconciliation.

RSE

Following the Ten Ten relationships education program, our focus this term will be looking at the topic 'Created to love others'. This session will help children to identify more complex relationships in their lives, including family, friends and other people; they will explore how to relate to people within these different relationships. Children will also discuss what it means to be a good friend, and learn some strategies to use when relationships become difficult.



Literacy

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This half term we will be concentrating on the following:

Reading: Weekly comprehension exercises and Guided Reading sessions will continue to develop comprehension skills. We would encourage you to continue to listen to your child read, discuss what has been read and read a range of different genres.

Spellings: Spelling rules will be taught weekly to be sent home to practice. Weekly spelling tests will take place.

Grammar: Specific stand-alone grammar lessons continue to form part of our Literacy timetable to develop understanding of varied sentence structure, punctuation and text development.

Fiction and Creative Writing: We will be developing our creative writing using stories. We will also be using stories from our topic subjects to inspire our writing. We will concentrate on developing settings for fiction writing and exploring a wide range of non-fiction writing such as diary entries and letter writing.



Mathematics

Number and Place Value: Children will continue to further their understanding of the number system including place value of three digits. This will include the ability to round numbers to the nearest 10, 100; children will continue to learn their 3, 4, and 8 times tables. They will continue to develop their column addition and subtraction up to 3 digits.

Fractions: Children will start to use fractions and will recognise and show fractions using, diagrams and equivalent fractions with small denominators. Recognise, find and write fractions of a discrete set of objects: unit fractions & non-unit fractions with small denominators. Compare and order unit fractions, and fractions with the same denominators

Measures: Length/ Mass/ Volume Measure, compare, add & subtract, Lengths (m/cm/mm), mass (kg/g) volume/ capacity (l/ml).

Multiplication & Division: Write and calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division using known multiplication tables, including 2-digit x 1-digit, using mental and progressing to formal written methods. Children will write and calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division using known multiplication tables, including the use of money and length.

Science



In our Science topic this term, we will be learning about Animals including Humans need the right types and amounts of nutrition. They cannot make their own food; they get nutrition from what they eat.

We will also identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement. We will work scientifically by identifying and grouping animals, compare, and contrast different diets of animals and humans.

Other Curriculum Areas

P.E: PE lessons will be on a Monday morning and we will be focusing on gymnastics. Our PE session with our coach, Mr Verga, will be on Wednesdays , so PLEASE ENSURE YOUR CHILD HAS THE APPROPRIATE PE KIT INCLUDING TRAINERS AND A PLAIN NAVY OR BLACK TRACKSUIT FOR OUTSIDE. Please ensure these are LABELLED.

Geography: We will be studying Europe – looking at the physical geography, various climates and comparing countries.

Design and Technology: We will be learning about healthy eating in science, so we will be making a healthy snack.

French: We will be looking at games and songs as well as celebrations.

Computing: This half-term, the children will be learning about the layout of keyboard and practising typing with left and right hand.

Pencil Case Equipment

Please ensure your child has a fully-equipped pencil case, including:

- Pencils / leads for mechanical pencils
- Sharpener

- Whiteboard pen

We are unable to provide these for the children.
