Literacy

Our central text for this half term is going to be Shakespeare's 'Macbeth', we will be focusing on the themes presented in this book aswell the features of playscripts.

Reading: Weekly comprehension exercises will continue to develop comprehension skills. We would encourage you to continue to listen to your child read and discuss what has been read.

Spellings: Spelling sounds/rules will be integrated into the weekly timetable and tested weekly.

Grammar: Specific stand-alone grammar lessons continue to form part of our Literacy timetable to develop understanding of varied sentence structure, punctuation and text development. The Curriculum requires teaching and use of formal grammatical terms, for example 'conjunctions' rather than 'connectives', 'fronted adverbials' rather than 'sentence openers' and multi-clause sentences.

Poetry: In our poetry lessons we will be focusing on works based in imagery and developing our understanding of poetic devices such as similes, adjectives and adverbs.

Fiction and Creative Writing: We will be developing our creative writing based upon 'MacBeth'.

Writing: Children will continue to produce pieces of extended writing and we are now focussing on reviewing and editing work to improve writing skills. Reviewing and editing are key skills in the curriculum, and we are noticing a positive impact on their work.

Mathematics

The second half of the summer term will be spent consolidating and building further upon our current knowledge and understanding in these key areas:

Number and place value/Fractions and Decimals: Children will revisit rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1,000, including numbers with one decimal place. In addition, children will consolidate their knowledge and understanding of ordering and comparing a sequence of numbers with up to one decimal place.

Geometry position and direction: children will identify acute and obtuse angles and compare and order angles up to 180 degrees.

Statistics: children will solve problems involving statistics using information presented in bar charts, pictograms, tables and other graphs.

Investigative and solving problems with maths: Where possible we will challenge children's investigative and reasoning skills to broaden their mathematical understanding.

The children will also sit their multiplication check during the first three weeks of this half term.



Religious Education

In our R.E. lessons we will be focusing on Belonging To The Church and our Church communities. We will discuss how we can be part of God's community and spread his good news.

<u>RSE</u>

In our RSE lessons we will be focusing on explores the individual's relationship with the wider world. Here we explore how human beings are relational by nature and are called to love others in the wider community through service, through dialogue and through working for the Common Good.



<u>Science</u>

Our unit of work for this half term will be 'electricity'. The children will be taught the following:

identify common appliances that run on electricity

• construct a simple series electrical circuit, identifying and naming its basic parts, including cells, wires, bulbs, switches and buzzers

♣ identify whether or not a lamp will light in a simple series circuit, based on whether or not the lamp is part of a complete loop with a battery

recognise that a switch opens and closes a circuit and associate this with whether or not a lamp lights in a simple series circuit

• recognise some common conductors and insulators, and associate metals with being good conductors.

Computing: This term, our topic is Making Music. We will experiment with rhythm and tempo and create a melodic phrase. Our second topic is Hardware Investigators, where we will learn to understand the different parts that make up a computer.

Geography: We will be doing a European study on the country of Italy.

French: We will finish our topic on animals and then complete a topic on the weather.

DT: Children will design and create a suitable desk tidy.

P.E: The children will be continuing their PE lessons with our PE coach Mr Verga continues on a Wednesday and with their class teacher on a Tuesday. The focus for this will be summer sports, games and cricket.

Useful information

1. Behaviour rewards: In Year 4, we praise children who display positive learning behaviours in a variety of ways.

4LM are rewarded with green ticks. If a child receives three green ticks, they will receive a raffle ticket which goes towards a prize. If a child is displaying negative behaviours, they will be given a verbal warning and this is followed by a red cross if the behaviour continues. When a child receives two red crosses, they will be given a time out in the other class to reflect and reset.

4CK are rewarded using Dojo's and a sticker chart. If a child is displaying positive behaviour they will receive a sticker. If a child recieves three stickers within a week, they will receive Dojo which they can exchange for raffle tickets. These raffle tickets can be used to obtain prizes. If a child is displaying negative behaviours, they receive a verbal warning. If a child corrects their behaviour they will have some thinking time, where they will reflect on their behaviour. However, if a child continues to display negative behaviour, they will be given a time out in the other class to reset and rejoin once they are ready.

In addition, every week we work towards one of our Core Values and children receive a certificate and recognition in our special assembly on a Friday.
