### **Religious Education**

Topic this half-term is 'Called to Serve', reflecting on our calling to be disciples of Jesus.

#### Literacy

**Writing:** We will continue with Carrie's War, basing our writing on themes from this classic novel. We will also be focusing on information writing.

**Speaking & Listening:** Performance skills will be honed through our Productions and Performances.

**Reading:** Comprehension exercises and reading sessions will continue to develop comprehension skills.

**Grammar:** Grammar is a key requirement for all primary age children and therefore is threaded throughout all lessons.

**Homework:** Literacy homework is set on Tuesday and should be submitted on Thursday. Some longer research-based pieces of Homework may have a longer deadline. This will be noted in the Homework diary.

#### **Mathematics**

**Problem-Solving:** We will be developing further our problem-solving skills. We will be reviewing our knowledge about number and how we use maths in every-day life. We will be having fun applying our knowledge to cracking codes and solving puzzles.

**Homework:** Homework is set on Tuesday and should be submitted on Thursday.

### <u>Science – animals, including humans</u>

Our topic continues- 'Animals, including humans', looking at the impact of diet, exercise, drugs & lifestyle on the way bodies function.

#### **RSE**

Our RSE topic is 'Keeping Safe', including keeping safe online and the importance of making good choices to look after our physical and mental health. We will also learn some basic first aid strategies.

#### **Other Curriculum Areas**

**P.E.:** St. Mary's PE kit (fully named) is vital and should be in school **each day**. If your child is chosen for a school team and borrows a school kit, please ensure your child returns the washed kit within two days. We have had many borrowed items going home and not being returned: please have a good look at home!

**Humanities:** We will be building our map reading skills and looking at Rivers of the UK and the world. In History we will study the achievements of one of the earliest civilisations, the Shang Dynasty.

**D.T/Art:** We will finish our DT topic, tasting, designing and baking scones. In Art, we will be studying the work of Georgia O'Keefe.

**Computing:** our topics include Binary & Networks.

**French:** this half-term's topic: *Quoi de neuf?* What's in the news?
