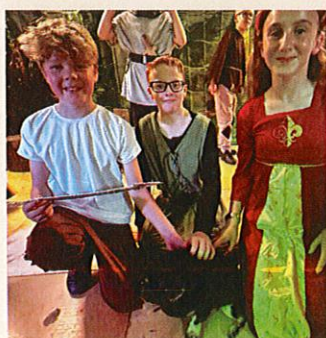

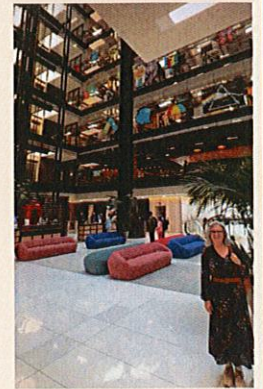
I am also blessed to be able to attend the forthcoming sports day and colour run at All Saints and Richard Crosse's final church service (both after this message goes out). Do

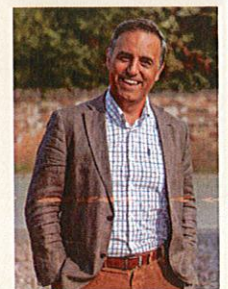
Some Goodbyes

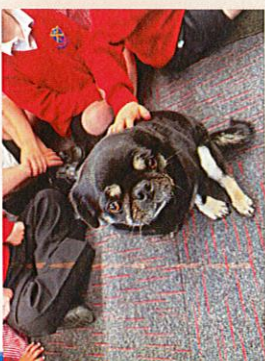
We thank her for everything and wish her the very best for the future. She will be greatly missed.
