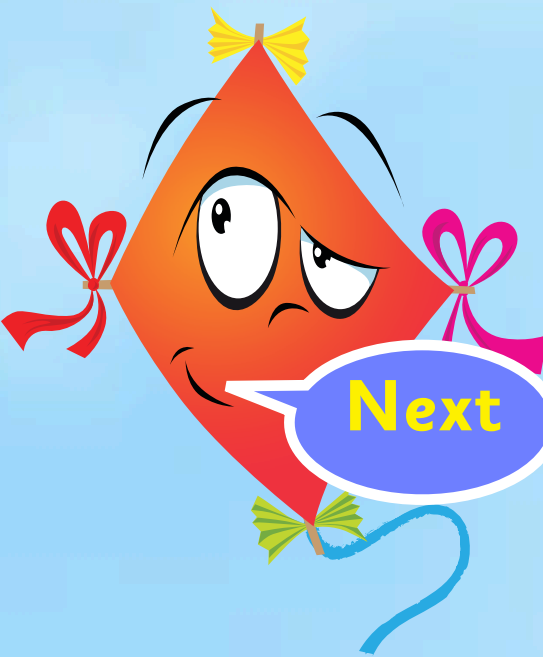


FLYING KITES

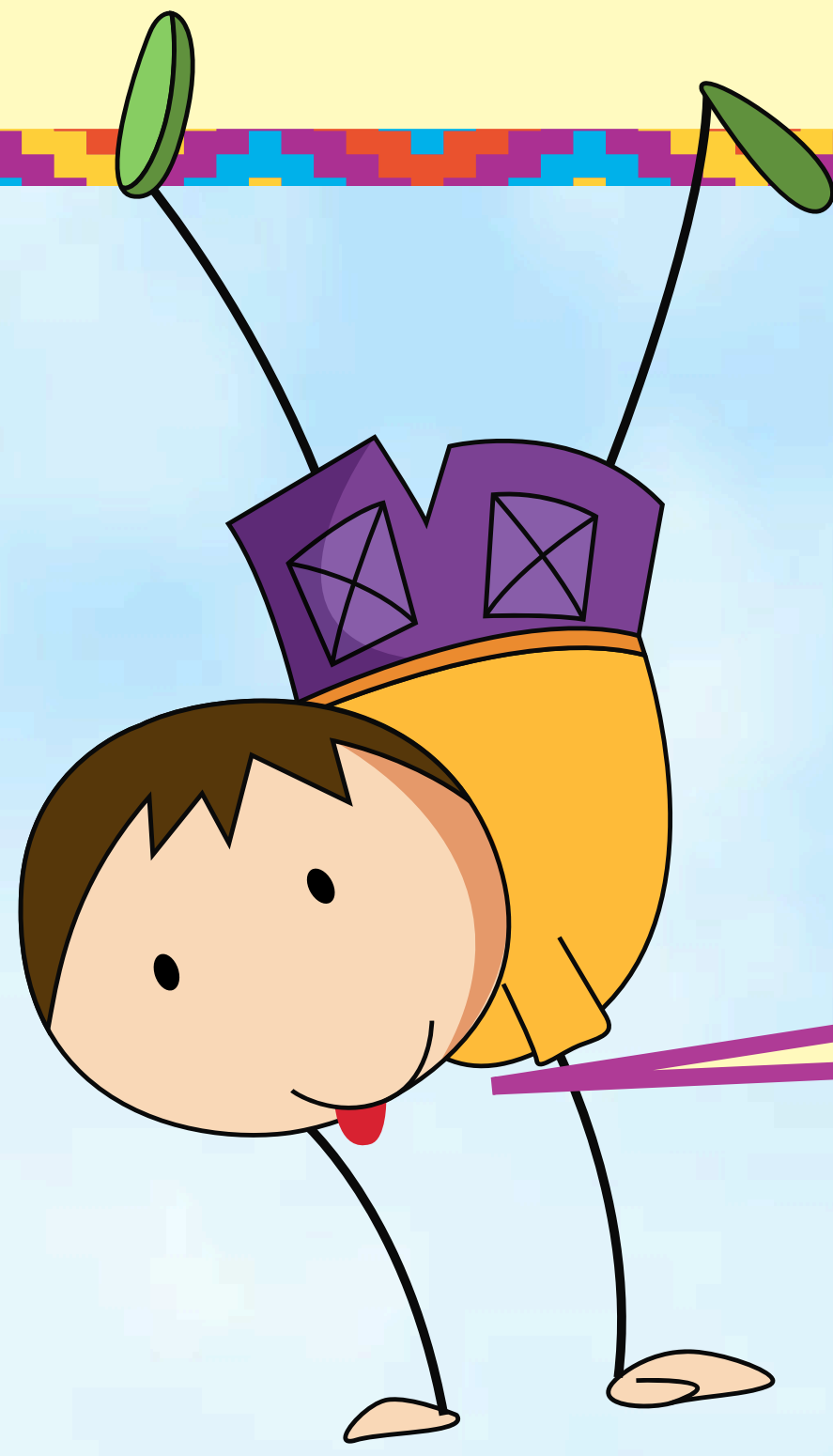
The kites had a hole in the middle to attach objects.



People in Japan also started using kites for a different reason.



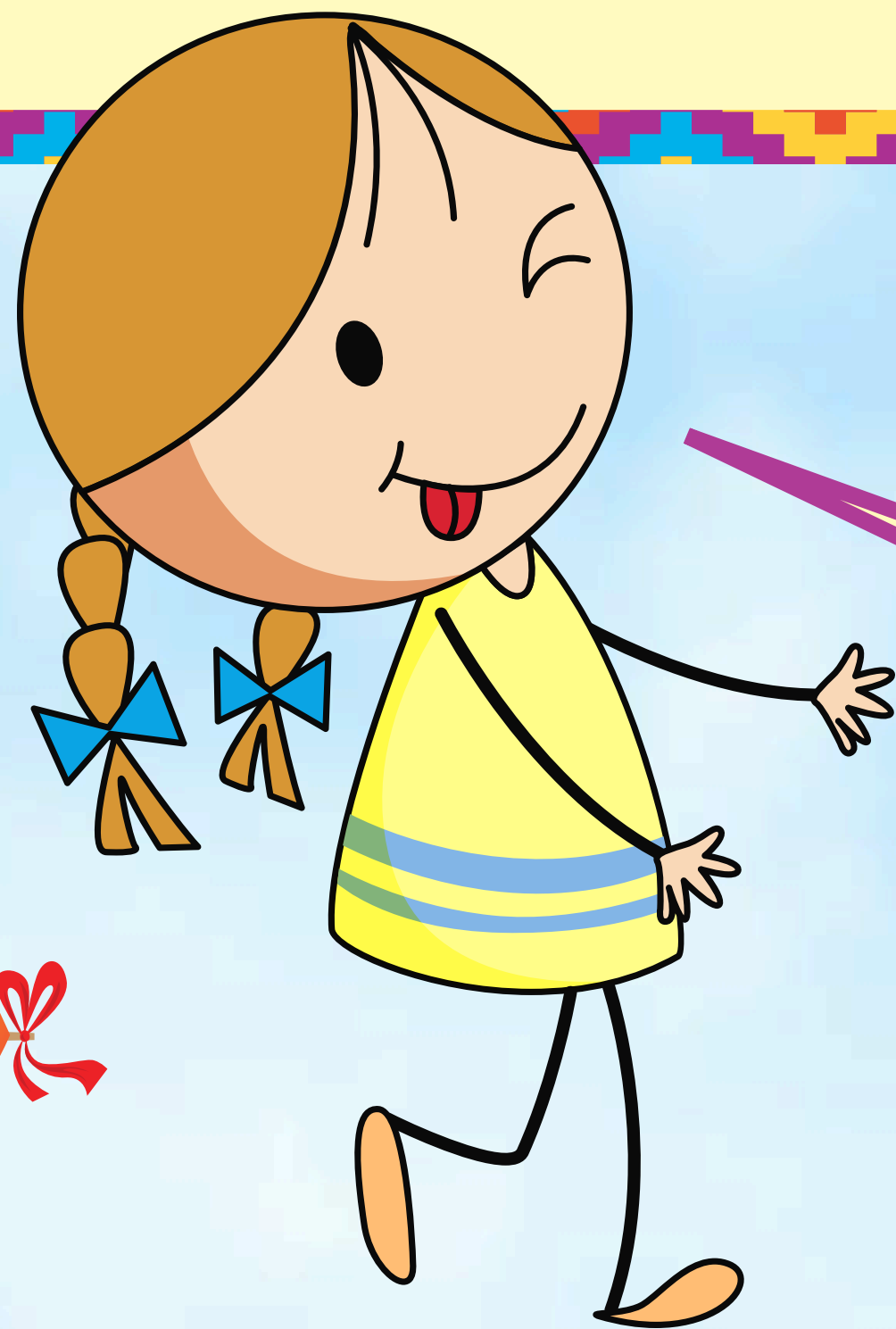
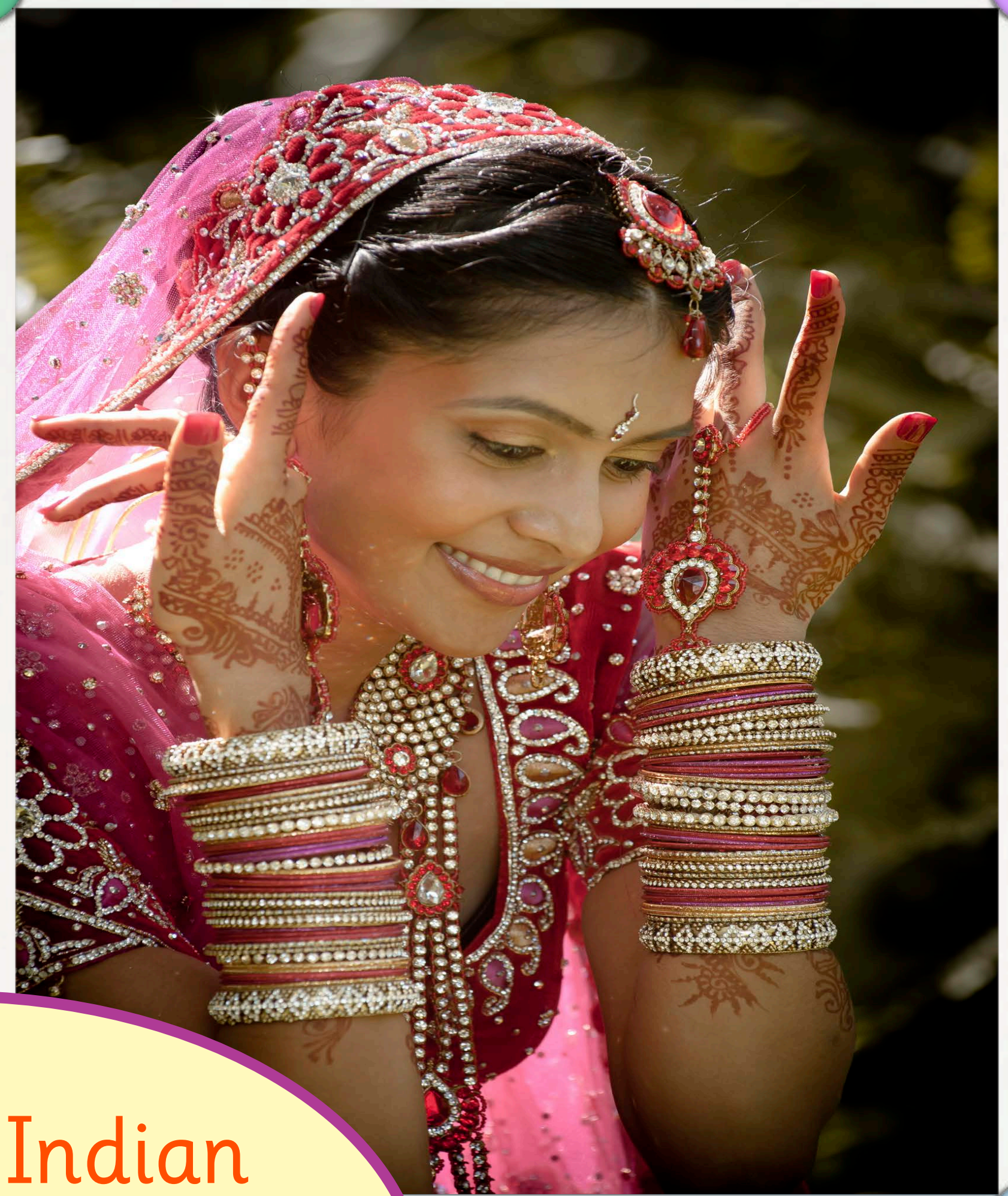
How did Japanese people use their kites?

It is believed that Japanese people decorated kites with evil faces to scare away bad spirits. Japanese people invented the Carp Kite, which is flown on Children's Day.



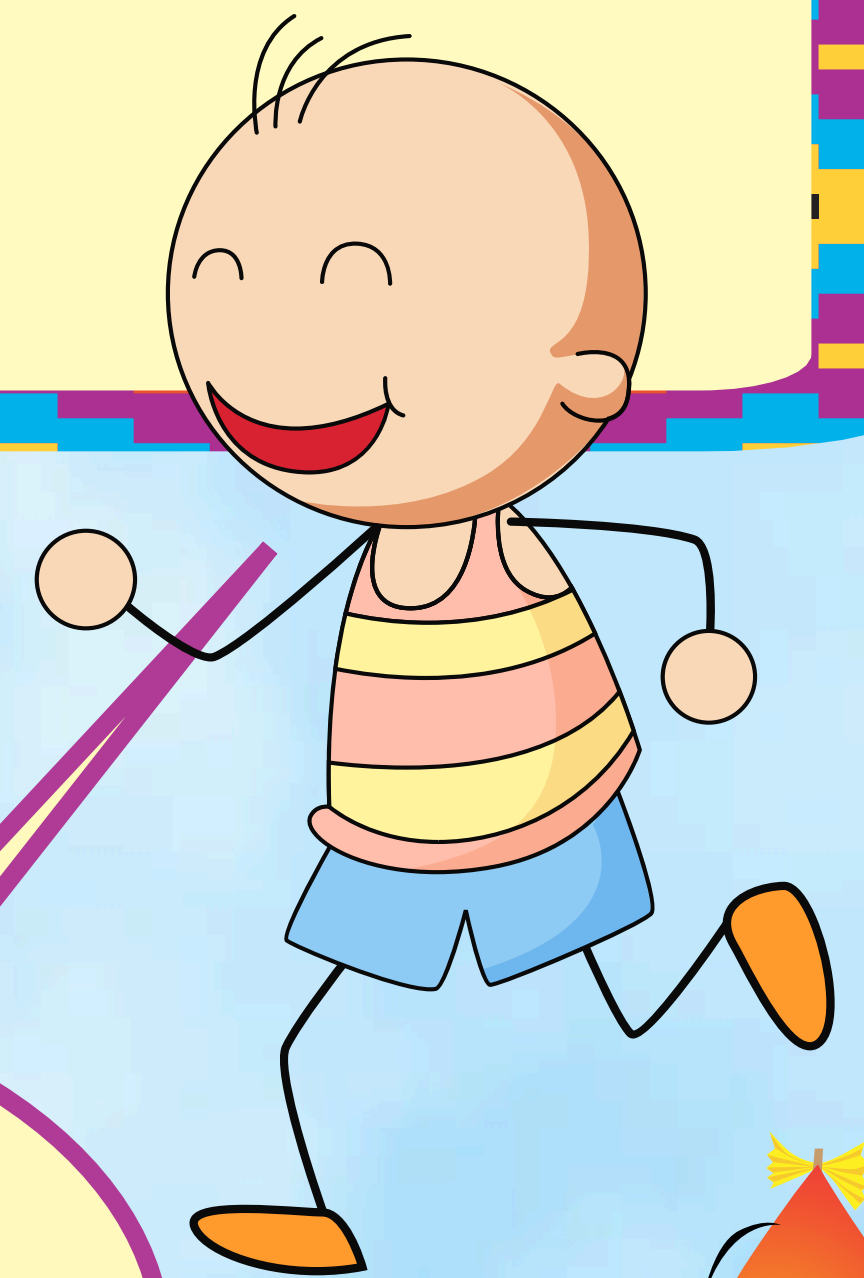
People in India also started using kites for a different reason.

It is believed that Indian people designed fighter kites. They are small kites and hard to fly. People spend time learning the techniques to fly the fighter kites.



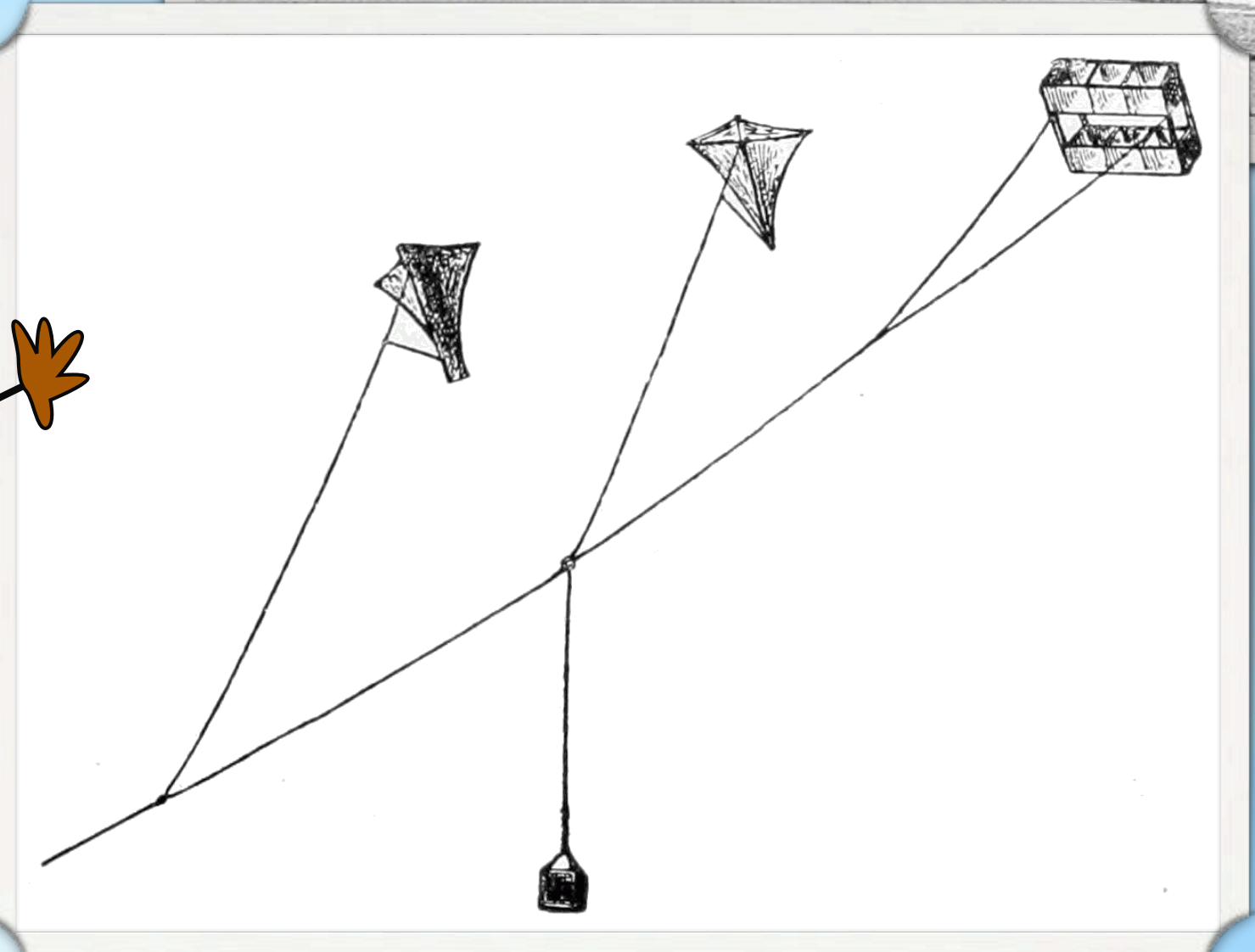
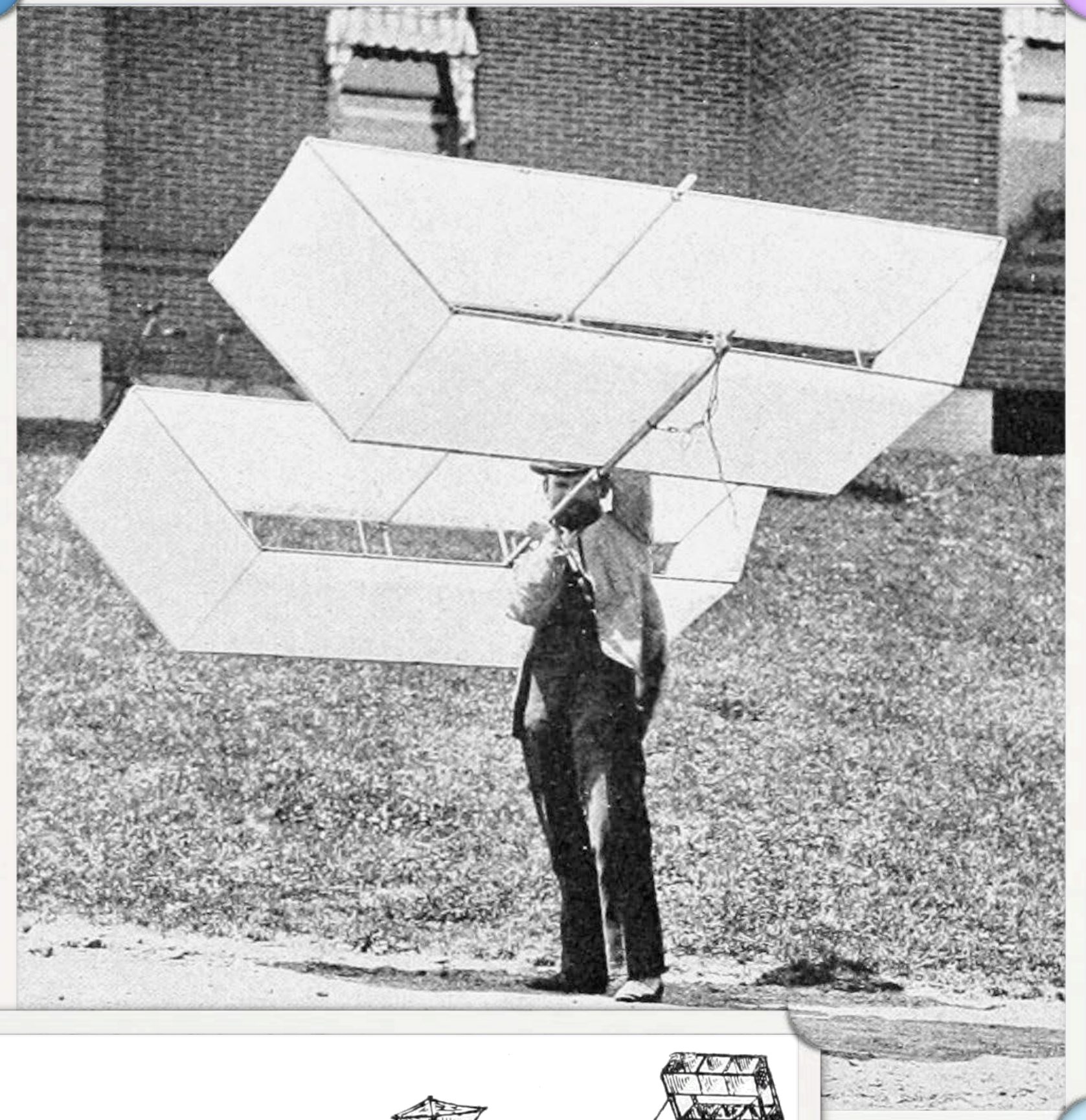
These kites are flown during kite season.

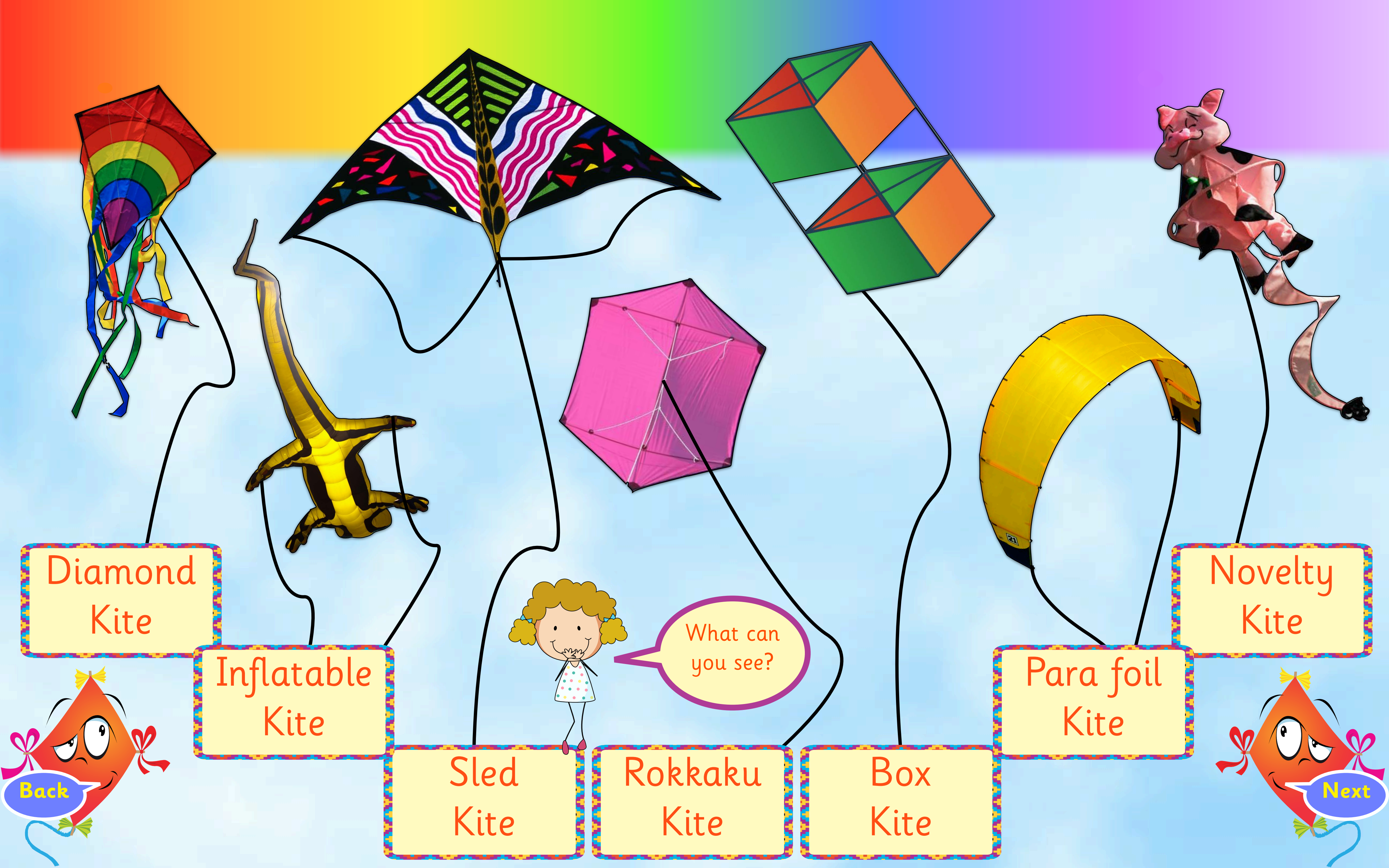
