What if I live in Colton?	
Children who live in Colton will be educated at St Mary's. This can also include morning care club facility from 7:45am. Staff members from the village will teach these children. Please note this is ONLY for local children as most staff members will be at Richard Crosse.	
What about dinners?	
If children are at Richard Crosse they can order a hot school dinner as normal. Those children attending St Mary's will need a packed lunch.	
What if St Mary's is open but the weather continues to get worse?	
Parents will be informed if children are to be collected early. This is to ensure the safety of the children and staff and allow everyone to leave the village safely. Every effort will be made to stay open. Local residents and parents will support with transporting children out of the village to the Bellamour Way junction.
