

Red and yellow flags mark the areas of water that are patrolled by lifeguards. This is the safest area to swim in.




Black and white chequered flags are marked out for use by craft (such as windsurfers and kayaks). It is not safe to swim in this area.



The red flag indicates danger. Never enter the water when the red flag is flying, under any circumstances.



The orange windsock indicates offshore winds. This means you should never use an inflatable when the windsock is flying.



Engine powered craft, should always be kept at a safe distance from beach activities.
