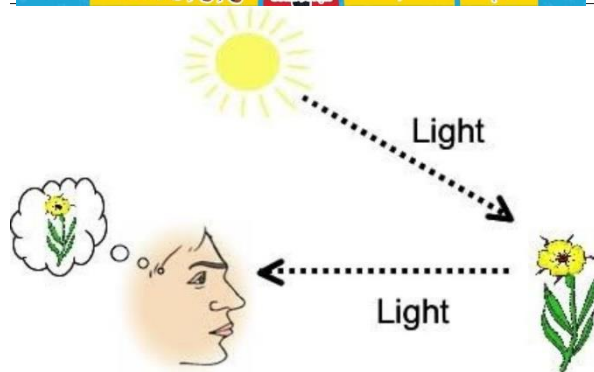
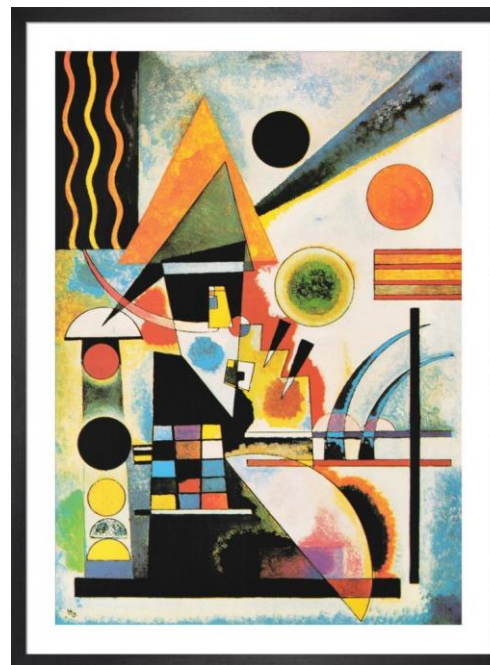

What should I already know ?

- That an orchestra is made up of numerous instruments lead by a conductor.
- The names of some instruments in an orchestra and the sounds they make.
- That light is needed to see things.
- That there are natural and manmade sources of light.
- That shadows are formed when a light source is blocked.



Key Vocabulary

Conductor – The leader of the orchestra. Making sure everyone is playing the right thing at the right time.

Colour spectrum – a band of colours as seen in a rainbow produced by the separation of components of light.

Opaque – When you can't see through something. Not letting light through.

Orchestra – A group of musicians playing together usually consisting of string, woodwind, brass and percussion instruments.

Reflection – When light bounces off an object.

Transparent – We you can clearly see through something. Letting light through.
