Ancient – belonging to the very distant past and no longer in existence.

Architecture – The art of designing and constructing buildings.

Athenians – People from Athens

Democracy- a system of government by the whole population or all the eligible members.

Governance – The act or manner of governing a state, organisation etc.

Government – The group of people with the authority to govern a country or state

Hoplites – A Spartan warrior or soldier

Immortal – living forever, nothing dying or decaying

Myths – a traditional story, especially one concerning the early history of people or explaining a social phenomenon. Typically involves supernatural beings or events

Olympics – relating to the ancient Olympia or the Olympic games.

Parthenon – A temple in Greece

Sculpture – the art of making two or three dimensional representatives or abstract forms, especially by carving stone or wood.

Spartans – the residents of Sparta

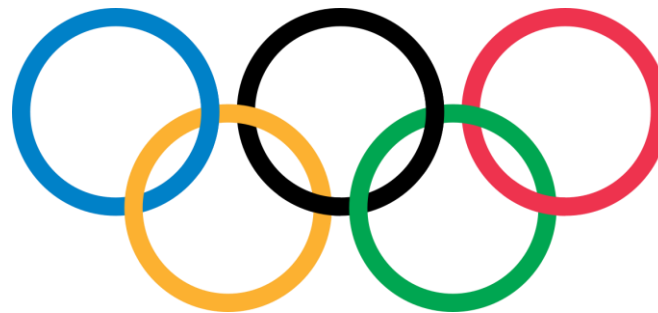
### Knowledge Organiser
