# Beginning and end of school day

Following concerns expressed to me by many parents, please can I once again appeal to the car drivers to consider if they really need to come by car and, if they do, to park away from Derby Square and walk the last part. I am increasingly concerned that we will have an accident before much longer; something I know that nobody wants to happen. Please exercise great care when driving along Derby Square at the beginning and end of the day.

We have a number of families who are regularly arriving late to school. Can we remind you that children should be in the classroom, ready to start at 8:55am and so should really be in school by 8:50am. We will be continuing to challenge those who are late and are exploring consequences for those who are the repeat 'offenders'.

### What you can do to help

Have a regular routine for the start of the day.

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Help your child make sure they have everything ready for the next day, the night before.

Set a reasonable bed time.

Primary school age children need between 10-12 hours sleep a night. A survey by the Children's Sleep Charity of found nearly a quarter (24%) of the teachers questioned admitted they had had to resort to letting children who are very tired sleep in a corner of the classroom. For two thirds of teachers (65%) the problem is so serious they consider that the long-term progress of their pupils can be affected.
