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Uniform

We are going to send out an additional letter with details on school uniform but want to remind you that we do expect the correct uniform to be worn and, from September, we will be closely monitoring this and contacting you if there are any issues.

For now, please remember:

- Plain black shoes
- Ear rings studs only and children need to be able to remove them by themselves.
- Hijabs shoulder length and tucked into the neck of the sweatshirt/polo shirt/dress. Hijabs for PE must be the proper PE ones or the hijab should be removed. This is in order to reduce the risk of injury during activity.

Year 5 - important information for parents when considering High School

We have been asked by Lancashire County Council to share the following information with you:

Dear Parents/Kinship Carers of Current Year 5 pupils

Before the summer holidays begin, we wanted to get in touch with you about next term's prospective secondary school application, and how important it is to consider home to transport prior to making your final decision.

You must consider carefully how your child will get to and from your preferred secondary schools before submitting your application for a school place.

Pupils will only be eligible for free travel if they have an entitlement under the County Council's <u>Home to School</u> <u>Transport Policy</u>. It is important, when selecting your preferences for a school place, that you have read and understood the information available on the <u>website</u> regarding <u>school admissions</u> and <u>travel assistance</u>.

It is essential to remember - for transport purposes - the 'nearest suitable school' is the nearest school to the family home – and - in some cases, the nearest school will be located within another local authority area.

If you choose to send your child to a school that Lancashire County Council does not consider to be the nearest suitable school, there is no duty to provide free transport. You will need to make your own transport arrangements.

Assistance with home to school travel will not be needed for most children as they will attend their local school which will be within a reasonable walking distance when accompanied by a parent/carer as necessary.

However, if transport costs are a concern to you, please contact your Area Education Office before submitting your application:

If your child is not eligible for free travel assistance but you would like your child to travel to school by bus, you may be able to buy a season travel pass from us.







The County Council will not provide extra services for non-statutory pupils and you will need to <u>plan how your</u> <u>child will get to school</u> if space on the bus is not available.

Please call 0300-123-6738 or visit <u>School bus season tickets - Lancashire County Council</u> to make an application.

It is important to plan ahead. Please make sure that appropriate transport is available, should a place be allocated at your preferred school.

Water Safety - a message from Lancashire Water Safety Partnership and Lancashire FIre & Rescue Service

Drowning Prevention - stay safe near water from The Lancashire Water Safety Partnership

When the warm weather hits, please don't be tempted to cool off by jumping into open water, particularly from height -

- The water is colder than it looks, even on a warm evening or sunny day
- This can lead to cold water shock
- Currents may be stronger than they look and even hidden
- There are often hidden dangers beneath the surface and water can be polluted



If you see someone in trouble in the water:

- Call 999;
- Tell them not to panic and, if they can't stand, to <u>float on their back</u> in a starfish shape. When calmer, encourage them towards you.
- Throw them something that floats or a throw/life line
