Dear Parents/Carers,

A very Happy New Year to you all from everyone here at St Matthew's! We hope that you have managed to stay well and safe and that the children are well rested ready for a new term.

Whether you are the type to make resolutions or not, I would like to encourage you to share with us in our PSHE focus for this half term of **Aspire to be...** (from our school Vision Statement) and also our school value for this half term of **Hope**. The last 2 years have been very challenging for us all on many levels but this should not divert us from aiming for the very best for ourselves and to look forward with hope. As usual, our worship this half term will be focusing on these two areas.



Industrial Action

Some of you will have been made aware by an article in the LEP over the holidays, the NEU (National Education Union) have announced 8 more days of strike action to take place within January. Sadly I have to inform you that the news report was correct and that we have been informed of the intention to undertake further strike days.

The dates announced are:

Tuesday 11th, Thursday 13th, Tuesday 18th, Wednesday 19th, Thursday 20th, Tuesday 25th, Wednesday 26th and Thursday 27th January.

I am currently investigating the possibility of classes unaffected by the action being able to continue attending and will let you know if this is to happen as soon as I am able to do so. However, please be prepared for the likelihood that the action will result in many children unable to attend school on those dates.

Building Project:

At last, some good news on this project! We have finally had the new electricity supply and electrical works within the building completed and are now waiting for Electricity North West to finally remove the original underground cable within the next few weeks so that we can begin construction to the front of the school building.

Over the next few weeks the contractors will be establishing their base in the church grounds and begin demolition of the old school office in readiness for the new build to begin!

Work has been undertaken within the school building and before the end of the month we hope to be able to begin using the new girls' toilets on the first floor! The boys' toilets have yet to be constructed and are within the next part of the build.

Attendance:

Attendance data for last term will be shared in the next newsletter. Thank you to everyone who has been making a concerted effort to get their children into school wherever possible.

Covid:

As you will possibly have seen in the local and national press, there is a determination not to have the virus have any further impact on education unless absolutely necessary. Thankfully the virus is not appearing to have as significant health impact thanks to the high uptake of the vaccine and boosters, although it does remain highly transmissible. Bearing that in mind, all adults in school are being asked to wear a mask in corridors and communal areas (not in classrooms whilst teaching) and we continue to keep windows open to allow the air to circulate. Please ensure that your child(ren) wear a jumper to school and also bring a warm coat to wear during break-times.

If you are unsure if you or your child have symptoms, please do not come to school but take a test and let us know the outcome – hopefully this year we will get to the stage where we are not impacted by the virus!

There are currently no plans to have to reinstate a 'bubble' system or to have staggered start and finish times to the day nor to have remote learning. However, we do need to be prepared that should local or national leaders call for it or should circumstances in school require it then they *may* have to come into effect. As always, we will try to give you as much notice as possible and only take such steps if we really have to.
