Attendance Information:

As you can see from the top of the newsletter, we have reinstated the weekly attendance information. If anyone wishes to request permission for their child(ren) to take extended leave away from school, please note that you are required to meet with either Mr Mackley or Mrs Walton to discuss your request. This is because the Government set very stringent targets on schools for attendance.



Uniform:

Please can I remind Parents/Carers that unless children are wearing suitable clothing for PE, they are expected to wear the correct school uniform (https://www.st-matthewscofe.lancs.sch.uk/parents/uniform). Recently we have noticed some children not wearing uniform on non-PE days, we have seen children wearing 'joggers' and trainers when they should be wearing trousers / skirts (with or without leggings) and plain black, smart footwear. Staff will be checking on uniform and challenging children who are not wearing uniform when they should be. If you are having difficulties with uniform, please do not hesitate to contact us to discuss.

If you are not sure which days of the week your child has PE on, their Teacher will be posting reminders via Dojo over the next few days.

When it is a PE day, children must have their ear-rings removed at home **before** coming to school. Thank you for your co-operation.

Mobile Phones in school:

A reminder that children are not allowed to bring a mobile phone to school and keep it in class. If children in Year 5 or Year 6 who walk home alone need to bring one for safety reasons, that is acceptable but these **must** be handed in to the school office on arrival to school and collected at the end of the day on the way home. We have had a few instances of children leaving phones in coats/bags which is not acceptable.

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Hothersall Lodge Trip (Y6):

Hothersall Lodge $-2^{nd} - 4^{th}$ March. Please see posts on Dojo about kit lists.

- Depart around 11am Wednesday 2nd March
- Return to school for normal time on Friday 4th March
- School will send a text out to say the time of arrival in case there are any delays.
- No electronics, including mobile phones to be brought on the trip.
- All medication to be in date, including inhalers. Children will NOT be allowed on the trip if medication and inhalers are out of date.
- All medication to be brought into school (including inhalers), if possible on Monday 28th February, in a clear bag with name, class and administration details.
- During the stay, medication will be administered with two members of staff present.
- Children will need to bring a packed lunch on the first day in a carrier bag so it can be thrown away.
- There is a tuck/gift shop at Hothersall Lodge which will be open one evening during the stay. Children are able to bring up to £10, no more, to spend if they wish. There is no expectation for this. Children who bring spending money will be in charge of looking after it themselves for the duration of the stay.
