Dear Parents/Carers,

This week sees a big step forward in the building project at the front of the school as the steelwork that forms the main structure should start to go up. This project has been nearly 2 years in development and so it is very exciting to see that it is progressing and taking shape. It is another chapter in the development of the buildings at St Matthew's, the first part was built in 1874 followed by further developments in 1879 & 1891. Around 1900 a few extensions were also added then in the 1950s more work was done. Over the years a lot of internal changes have been made so this is definitely the biggest change for some considerable time.

Thank you for your continued patience in using the temporary entrance from Delaware Street; we know it is not ideal and we will have to continue with this until around December time. Please continue to bear with us as at times the office staff have to leave the office and deliver information around the school and they will answer the gate/phone once they are back in.

Finally, if there have been any concerns / issues with your child and another child please come and talk to staff in school about it and let us address them. Please don't speak directly to the children involved or their parents as in our experience this rarely resolves the issue. Staff are able to deal with nearly all issues within school.
