Every day counts

Attendance across school is a growing concern. You will have seen on the newsletter that class totals have been regularly well below the expected figure of 96%. We know we have had chicken pox going round in the younger years but need we to make sure the improvements we have made in attendance continue for the rest of the school year and ask for your help with this. This gives your children the best chance at making a success of their education, no matter how young or old they are and being ready for their next stages of learning – whatever they are. This will give your child the chance to make choices and options when they are older and plan their future. We want to give all our children the chance to flourish and aspire.

Attendance Ladder



96% or higher is the Government's expected attendance for ALL children in ALL schools across the whole country. This equates to only 7 days off in a school year. If your child has already had 7 days off school they have 'used up' their absences for the year.

Attendance of 90% or below is **persistent absence** – this is 20 days off in the school year and has a huge impact on a child's ability to learn and make progress effectively. 90% attendance means that your child is absent from lessons for the equivalent of one half day every week. Over five years this is the equivalent of about half of a school year. We have to report all Persistent Absence to Lancashire County Council.

It is a parent / carer's duty to ensure their child attends school regularly, and our duty as a school to do all we can to encourage and enable good attendance. Court action can be, and is being, taken by school if children have unauthorised absences. Once your child has 5 days unauthorised absence we are asked to fine for poor attendance and have been doing so, and the number of fines that have had to be issued is sadly rising. Continued persistent absence can also lead towards court proceedings and prosecution.

We are also fining ALL families who choose to book holidays / time off school and therefore miss important learning for their child. We take children's education and progress seriously – please help us by making sure they are in school every day.
