Ramadan

As this important time of year is underway, I would like to clarify the arrangements within school. All children attending school will continue to take part in all aspects of school including PE which is a statutory part of the curriculum. Following consultations that have taken place at national level, the recommendation is that children aged 11 years and



over would be expected to fast during Ramadan and therefore we expect very few children in school to be fasting. We recognise that some younger children may wish to fast but we respectfully ask that this is carried out at the weekends.

For health and safety reasons, no child will be allowed to fast without parental consent. If we feel that a child who is fasting becomes unwell, we will contact you to collect them from school.

If you wish your child to fast, you will need to arrange for them to be collected by an adult during lunchtime so that they may rest and conduct necessary prayers – we do not have the space to facilitate this within school.

Please complete and return the slip at the end of this newsletter if you wish your child to fast. We wish you and your family every good wish for the forthcoming Eid celebrations.


