Online Safety:

Through our Kidsafe lessons in school where the children are given safe spaces to discuss important topics, we have become aware that a worrying number of children are active on a range of Social Media platforms.

Most platforms have a **minimum** age of 13 to join or use and some have higher age restrictions. May we remind parents and carers of



the need to be aware of what their children are doing online and that to say no to a child who is too young to make use of social media is a good thing!

Snapchat. We have been made aware that a group of children from our school and others are in a group on Snapchat and that some of the conversations that have taken place outside of school have now been causing problems between children within school. Snapchat is **not** a good social media platform for children to be on all messages disappear almost instantly making it almost impossible to investigate any issues. If your child has a Snapchat account, can we please urge you to remove it as they do cause a lot of problems.





Another platform we need to make you aware of is Discord - the minimum age for this platform is **17** years old and there have been a number of recent controversies around material which is freely available that is not only unsuitable for children but also very concerning in nature.

Please do talk openly with your children about being safe online and also make sure you know what they are up to!



Since the beginning of February when we joined the Cidari Multi Academy Trust, we have been able to make some significant investments in resource in school and there is more due to arrive!

All the Infant classes have had brand new Promethean Interactive Screens installed which have dramatically improved the quality of presentation of learning materials available. I am delighted to inform you that over the next month we will be busy preparing for the installation of these screens in all the Junior classrooms and in the Nursery class!

Not only that, Years 3 to 6 will all be receiving a class set of Chromebooks to share across the year group. This means that children will be able to access a wide

range of digital resources to support their learning. One such is an award winning piece of software called "Learning

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by Questions" (<u>www.lbq.org</u>) which has already been put into use in some classes and is proving very popular and useful!
