It is **not** Ofsted, that is a completely different process! As the name would suggest, this focuses on the church school aspect of St Matthew's; it is a one day inspection with one inspector. We have high hopes that we have a really positive outcome from this but I will not be able to let anyone know the outcome for a few weeks.

We are looking forward to welcoming the inspector and showing her all the good things about life at St Matthew's!

A bit more detail....

The inspection begins at 8:00 am and runs through until 6:00 pm and is a very busy day indeed! The inspector will be speaking with staff, Governors, representatives from the Diocese and Cidari to seek information to help her reach a conclusion and make judgement about us as a Church School. More importantly than all of these fine people, she will be spending time speaking with a range of children about life at St Matthew's in order to help her answer the key question for a church school inspection:

"How effective is the school's distinctive Christian vision, established and promoted by leadership at all levels, in enabling pupils and adults to flourish?" Quite simply, she will be considering how our vision

## Important Safety Concern



We are very concerned about the number of children who have 'BB' guns. Recently a couple of children have brought theirs into school to 'show off' to their friends. Contrary to popular belief, they are not toys and are actually quite dangerous weapons; a simple search on the internet for 'bb gun wound' brings up some quite disturbing results. The pellets could easily blind someone if they are shot into an eye; we are sure no-one would want that to happen to their child or for their child to be responsible for this happening.

With the rise in gun culture and the damage that they cause, seeing them as toys is a very worrying issue for us. Please also note that the Police take very seriously any reports of anything resembling a gun being seen in public, even brightly coloured

ones. If your child is seen in the streets with such a weapon, it could easily be mistaken and cause some very serious misunderstandings.

I need to make it **very clear** to everyone that from now on, if we have any incident of such a weapon being brought into school, it will be treated with the **utmost seriousness**. This means that an exclusion will be considered, the weapon will be confiscated and destroyed and we will be in touch with the local community Police officers to have a conversation with the offender. I am really hopeful that this will not need to happen but please be under no illusion that I take this issue very seriously indeed.

In our worship this week we have been thinking again about our vision and what it means for each one of us.
