Harvest Festival - Bishop Julian's Appeal

The money will go towards the Bishop's appeal, supporting the work of the Mosamaria Trust working in South Africa with Vulnerable Children and Orphans. The packets will go to a local Foodbank. Please bring packets of dried food, pasta, rice, packets of sanitary products, toothpaste, baby wipes etc. As usual, we ask that you bring what you can – one donation per family is great and will make a big difference!

High School Applications – reminder – closing date 31st October

Year 6 pupils went on a super visit to a local High School last week. This is all part of their transition - getting ready to move on into the next stage of their education – it seems so early! They had a fabulous time and were busy all morning with a range of interesting activities.

If your child is currently in Year 6, please remember that the closing date for applications for Secondary School is the 31st October. All applications need to be made via the following link https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place/apply-online-for-a-school-place/ If you are applying to a faith based school, you will also need to complete their Supplementary Information Form.

Applications for Primary School places are also open and can be made via the same link. If you have a child starting Reception in September 2022 or you know someone who has, please make your application – the deadline is 15th January 2022. We will be providing some sessions where we can show prospective parents around our school - details to follow.

Attendance & punctuality

We are having a big 'push' in school on increasing attendance and punctuality. I'm sure you'll have seen the huge banners, and noticed even more reminders about this since we started back this year. The figures for attendance are on the newsletter each week and I am worried that so many classes are still yellow or red for attendance. This is all below the Government's figure of 96%. To stay within the target of 96% a child must be off only a very small number of days across the whole school year. The impact of



not coming to school every day on children's learning and friendships is huge, and we really want these to improve.

Please don't allow your child to take an odd day off for shopping, birthdays, to visit relative and friends, for a lie in or a little sniffle. We need all our pupils in school every day - let's get all those classes to green!

Miss Parkinson, our Family Support Worker, will be monitoring attendance closely along with Mrs Naik, and will supporting our children and families to get into school on time every day and stay 'green'!

Miss Parkinson will also be monitoring the children who arrive late each day to school – please note that arriving late at school may also be recorded as an unauthorised absence which could ultimately lead to a fine.

Request for Leave of Absence

We do not allow or authorise time off school for holidays, and time off which is unauthorised can attract a fine. If you need to request some time off school for your child due to exceptional reasons, you must complete a request form before taking the leave. You will also be asked to attend a meeting with a senior member of staff to discuss the request **before any flights are booked or arrangements made.** Unfortunately, we have already had a number of requests in school since we returned after the holidays, and these families have had meetings with us in school to discuss these. We are pleased however, that a number of these families are now re-considering their arrangements. Please do not book any holidays or family visit during term time - we need all our pupils in school every day.

Community Police News



Thank you for your help in keeping good order when our children are leaving school at the end of the day. It's a busy time, and our staff need to make sure that each child leaves safely with the correct adult! Due to some issues with illegal parking and vehicles stopping in the roadway, the police have informed us that they will be doing some random visits to Derby Square at beginning and end of the school day. Prayer:


A prayer inspired by the Parable of The Good Samaritan:
