If your child is currently in Year 6, please remember that the closing date for applications for Secondary School is the 31st October. All applications need to be made via the following link https://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-education-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place/apply-online-for-a-school-place/ If you are applying to a faith based school, you will also need to complete their Supplementary Information Form.

Applications for Primary School places are also open and can be made via the same link. If you have a child starting Reception in September 2022 or you know someone who has, please make your application – the deadline is 15th January 2022. We will be providing some sessions where we can show prospective parents around our school - details to follow.

Year 5 Environment Work

Year 5 have been learning about how the simple things we can all do each day which will go a long way to helping save our planet and make the environment a better place. These photos show you some of the things they have been doing! The children designed and displayed posters around school reminding everyone to switch things off when not in use and to remember to recycle. After learning about how many single-use plastic bottles are thrown away each day and the harm they cause, the children thought about upcycling plastic bottles, boxes and trays. They were very pleased with their pencil pots, plant pots, bird feeders and treat boxes.



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Writing around school

One of our big focuses this year is on getting the children to both write more and to improve the quality of their writing. Over last week and this coming week, Mr Mackley and Mrs Walton are visiting classes to see lots of different ways that the staff are supporting the children in developing their writing skills; not just in English lessons but right across the curriculum!

Religious Education

Last Friday afternoon, Rev McHaffie the vicar of St Matthew's spent the afternoon with Miss Smith who is the Subject Leader for RE and visited a number of classes to see the children in their RE lessons and to talk with them about their work and their understanding. Rev McHaffie commented on how much he enjoyed the opportunity and how impressed he was with the children.
