What is Domestic Abuse?

Domestic abuse is when someone behaves in an abusive or violent way towards another person, usually within the home. In most cases, the victim is a woman. One in four women experience domestic violence in their life time.

Domestic abuse can be physical, psychological, sexual, financial, and emotional or a combination of these, and can affect people of any age and from all backgrounds and cultures.

Domestic violence can be committed by women against male partners and can take place in both heterosexual and gay or lesbian relationships. It can also be committed by another family member.

Domestic abuse is a crime

It is not your fault if you experience domestic abuse. You can't make someone hit, verbally abuse or harass you – it's their choice and only they are responsible. Drink or drugs are not an excuse.

No one deserves to be abused; everyone has the right to live free from fear, intimidation and abuse, especially within their own home.

If you are a tenant of Community Gateway we can help

The Tenancy Management Team can offer advice and support to victims of domestic abuse who are CG tenants. We understand how devastating such abuse can be and how difficult it can be to gather the courage to do something about it.

If you approach us for support we will ensure that:

- You are treated with compassion and discretion
- Your confidentiality and privacy are respected
- We will agree all actions with you and that we only take action with your consent.

We can offer help such as:

- Offering advice and support
- Offering referrals to specialist support agencies
- Advice about housing options
- Provision of extra security
- Taking enforcement action against the perpetrator of the abuse, such as applying for an injunction, or taking possession proceedings.

l am a tenant experiencing domestic abuse, what are my housing options?

- If you are at risk of immediate or significant harm then please contact the Police. In an emergency dial 999 or in a non-emergency contact Preston Police station by dialling 101
- If possible go and stay with someone you know and trust, where you feel you will be safe
- Emergency accommodation may be available in a refuge; contact Safenet Refuge Preston

If it is safe to remain in your home:

Contact the Tenancy Management Team and make them aware of the situation so they can discuss your options with you, these may include:

Sanctuary Scheme

The main feature of the scheme is to provide extra security such as locks on windows, emergency lighting, and additional locks on internal and external doors to create a safer environment where you can call and wait for the arrival of the Police.

Legal Remedies

There are different court orders such as injunctions, non-molestation orders and/or occupation orders which can be considered.

Domestic Abuse occurs when one person tries to bully or control another. The responsibility lies entirely with that person. Please contact someone for help.
