


Parent Survey, November 2023 Results and responses


(1 = Strongly Agree, 2 = Agree, 3 = Agree nor Disagree, 4 = Disagree, 5 Strongly Disagree)



My child is happy at this school. 125 responses



My child feels safe at this school. 125 responses




It is so important that children feel safe at our school, we worry that some do not and would encourage those who feel this way to contact their child's teacher so that we can work to address your concerns.


The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved. 121 responses



We have done a lot of work to ensure that pupils are well behaved at all times. Clearly this is mostly successful and we know we do have a good reputation for the positive behaviour of our children. Clearly it is not perfect, we are all human and sometimes we all, children included, can make poor decisions which lead to mistakes. We see all behaviour as communication and every incident is an opportunity to reflect and learn and to try not to repeat the same mistake.




We are delighted with the response to this question and we are aware that the word 'bully' can be much misunderstood by many and we have a lot of experience of people using the word incorrectly. To help us and the children understand, we take the STOP approach; bullying is Several Times On Purpose. When children come to us we always work to address any behaviour concerns in order to prevent bullying taking place. Where allegations of bullying are made we **always** investigate them and ensure we put support in place not only for any possible victims of bullying but also for the perpetrators so that they can learn from their mistakes.



The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year. 120 responses




When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly. 72 responses


My child has SEND, and the school gives them the support they need to succeed.' $_{\rm 30\,responses}$




My child does well at this school. 103 responses

The school lets me know how my child is doing. 103 responses




There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school. 103 responses




The school supports my child's wider personal development. 101 responses
