

Year 5 Curriculum Letter

Autumn Term 1

Welcome back! We hope you have had a wonderful summer break and we look forward to keeping you informed about what is happening in class via the Curriculum Letters and Knowledge Organisers each half term.

Key Information

Class teachers are Mrs Bryden, Miss Brennand and Mrs Rossall. The school day starts at 8:55am and finishes at 3:15pm. Children are to use the entrances on Derby Square in a morning (gates open at 8:45 am) and will leave from the nursery gate at home time. English



In English, we will be reading more Viking Sagas before writing our own. We will be focussing on our grammar skills of using ed openers for our sentences, for example: Exhausted from sailing the turbulent seas, the Vikings landed in England.



Spellings will be set on a Monday and tested on a Friday. Please ensure your child reads at home and records it in their reading record.

Maths

Our focus to begin with is on Place Value. We will be covering the following objectives:

Read Roman numerals to 1000 (M) and recognise years written in Roman numerals.

Read, write, order and compare numbers to at least 1000000 and determine the value of each digit.

Count forwards or backwards in steps of powers of 10 for any given number up to 1000000.

Interpret negative numbers in context, count forwards and backwards with positive and negative whole numbers including through zero.

Round any number up to 1000000 to the nearest 10, 100, 1000, 10000 and 100000 Solve number problems and practical problems that involve all of the above.


Our Year 5 maths target for this half term is to learn multiplication and division facts for the 9, 11 and 12 x tables.

R.E

We have started our unit exploring the Bible. We will be researching the books of the Bible and its importance to Christians today. The children will see and handle a wide variety of Bibles, talk to an adult about how and why they use/read the Bible, compare the teaching of the Bible and Christian behaviour, and will make connections between Bible passages and Christian values, attitudes, or beliefs.



Science



Over this half term, Year 5 will be learning about different types of materials and classifying them according to their properties. This will be building on Year 4 work on solids, liquids, and gases, considering whether the materials are conductors, insulators, magnetic and exploring types of materials. We look forwards to learning practically,

through investigations and developing our scientific vocabulary.

<u>Art</u>

We will be exploring and recreating Viking art and identifying its key characteristics and features, using observations, photographs, and digital images. We will be exploring shading and using techniques such as stippling. We will be investigating ways of joining clay - scratch and slip and will evaluate our finished work. We look forwards to sharing our masterpieces with you.



<u>History – Vicious Vikings</u>

We will be finding out about the Vikings, the threat from the sea! We will be exploring artefacts and gain a greater understanding of how the Vikings gained their understanding. Please see attached Knowledge Organiser for more information.

P.E. is on Monday and Tuesday afternoons. We begin with developing netball skills on a Monday and then will be continuing with yoga on a Tuesday afternoon with Mrs Howard. Please ensure PE kit is in school on both days, earrings removed, and any long hair tied back.

In computing, we are enjoying coding and have begun to make our own codes and algorithms to program computers. We are using Purple Mash to do this. Your child has their own personal log in so can practise this at home. There is also a variety of games and activities for your child to complete on this site.



PSHE



We have been discussing growth mind-set and will be completing activities linked to our community over the coming weeks. We will be discussing, developing ideas, and contributing to help our environment, such as recycling, reducing, and re-using.
