## English


We are beginning our English this half term by focussing on biographies. We will learn a biography using the

"Talk for Writing" approach and then write our own using a range of skills such as relative clauses for effect.

After this we will be focussing on 'classical literature' texts. Our class novel will be The Wizard of Oz by L Frank Baum. Children will be immersed in the classic text, as well as being provided the opportunity to read, compare and contrast other texts. There will be a

wide range of writing opportunities including creating a short story modelled on the novel, poetry writing and writing in role of the characters. We will also continue to teach new grammar and punctuation skills, as well as embedding older skills.

# Maths



## Creative Curriculum

Our theme this half term is 'A Life in Colour.' Children will listen to a range of different genres in music and will use this to respond to in Art. In science we will be learning about light and how it travels, using different investigations to explore this further.

## RE

Our unit this term will focus on how Christians prepare for Christmas. We will explore the meaning of advent and get a deeper understanding of why Christians celebrate at this time of the year.







PE

We have P.E on a Tuesday and Thursday this half term and due to current events will continue to focus on exercise and games which can be played with good social distancing.

#### Computing



This half term we will be continuing our work on Computer Science with a heavy look at coding skills using the Purple Mash software. We will end the unit by writing and creating the code for our own games.
