<u>Attendance and</u> <u>Punctuality Matter!</u>

I would like to remind all parents about the vital importance of attendance and punctuality. Every lesson counts towards your child's learning; absence or lateness during term time seriously hampers children's achievement. Children only get one chance at school, and your child's chances of a successful future may be affected by not attending school every day on time.

when children do not attend or are late, they:

- struggle to keep up with school work
- miss out on the social side of school life especially at primary school.

Poor attendance can affect children's ability to make and keep friendships, a vital part of growing up.

Even one day missed can have an effect on learning:

- 98% attendance means four school days missed
- 95% attendance means 10 school days missed
- 90% attendance means 19 school days missed
- 80% attendance means 38 school days missed
- Five minutes late each day means three school days missed

Please avoid taking your children out of school during term time, so that they can maximise their amazing learning opportunities at school.

<u>Don't underestimate the</u> importance of 100% attendance!

Year 15 enjoyed a visit to Bolton Library. We explored the books, listened to different stories and completed a spring craft. It was a lot of fun






