





### Nursery





















#### **Sports Day**

Year 2 paid a visit to the Fire Training School in Bury. We learnt about road safety, call centres and fire safety. It was a great day!










Year 2 went to Blackpool and had an amazing time. We walked along the pier, ate fish and chips, played in the sand and paddled in the sea.

Chess champion for 2021-22 was Siena Aliu from Year 4F. Well done Siena!


















### Walt. understand the strength of an earthquake and the integrity of a building (Sc)


Over the last few weeks both Year 6 classes have taken a trip to Blackpool beach. We had a wonderful time and here are some of our pictures.
