<p>Once a week or once a fortnight depending on individual work rate.</p> <p>Recall tasks set weekly Assessed question set fortnightly</p>	<p><b>Art and Design: Textiles/Graphic Communication</b> Complete work linked to GCSE Assessment Objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Artist research AO1</li> <li>• Observational Studies AO2</li> <li>• Design development AO3</li> <li>• Final piece AO4.</li> </ul> <p><b>Food Preparation and Nutrition</b> Complete work linked to GSCE Assessment Objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• AO1: Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of nutrition, food, cooking and preparation.</li> </ul> <p>AO2: Apply knowledge and understanding of nutrition, food, cooking and preparation.</p>	<p>Approximately 45 minutes on each task. (However, work students are completing for homework may be continuous pieces that were not completed in lesson.)</p> <p>Examples of work are shared with students for each assessment objective.</p>	<p>This work will be part of the student's projects which forms their portfolio of course work (60% of the overall GCSE grade).</p> <p>Teacher assessed questions will be marked and graded in practice for final summer exam.</p>
