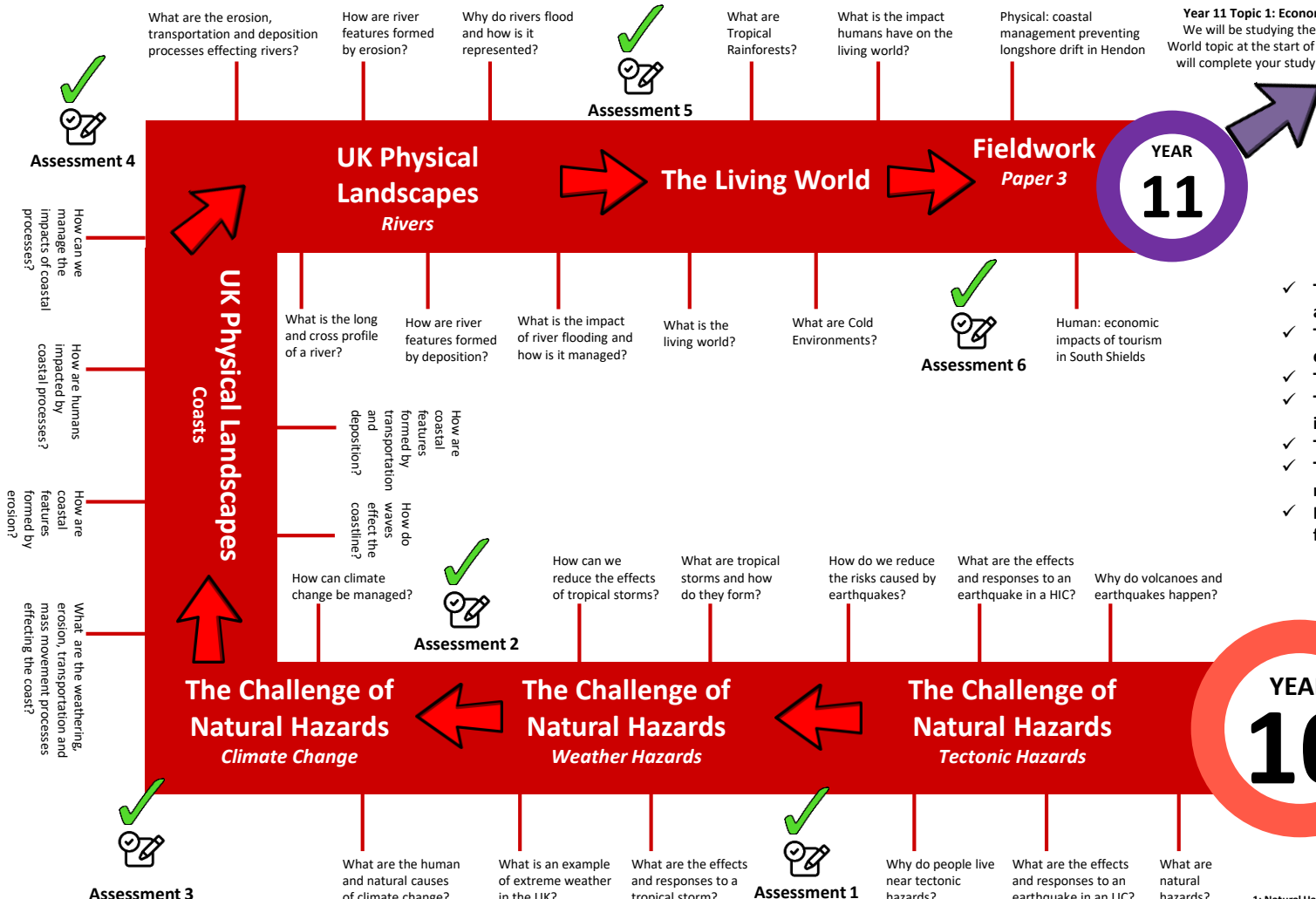


# Y10 Geography Learning Journey

The location and formation of tropical storms, cause, effect and response to tropical storms, extreme weather in the UK
- 3: Natural Hazards**  
Covering all tectonic and weather hazards and climate change
- 4: UK Physical Landscapes Coasts**  
The processes involved in forming different coastal features, the impacts and management of coastal erosion
- 5: Resource Management**  
The location and processes involved in forming different river features, the impacts and management of flooding
