## Reminders

**Absence** – If your child is going to be absent, please leave a message on the school answerphone, 01252 324300, before 9:00am or email the school office. Episodes of sickness or diarrhoea will require your child to be absent for 48 hours after the last episode. Chicken pox requires your child to stay home until all the spots have scabbed over and for a minimum of 5 days. Children should not be in school with a temperature.

**Medical appointments** – please remember to send through evidence of your child's appointment. If your child will be absent for registration but needs a school lunch, please let the office know so we can choose an option for them.

**Medicines in school** – We can only accept medicines with a prescription label on which clearly displays the child's name and date of birth. Medicines whether long term or short term must come through the school office only please; do not put medicines in your child's book bag. Parents will need to complete a permission form too. Whilst we are able to administer some pain relief, we are unable to give ibuprofen, unless it is prescribed by a GP.

**Playing on the playground equipment before or after school** – please do not let your child use our playground equipment either before or after school. Children must be supervised by school staff when using the equipment, otherwise we are not insured. Thank you for your understanding

**Water bottles** – please send your child in with a named water bottle every day.

**Change of contact details or address** – if any of your contact details have changed over the summer, please remember to update the office. If you have moved house, please send through a copy of a proof of your new address for our records.

**PE days – Year 1 and Year 2 - Please send your child in with a PE kit as soon as possible.** Please make sure earrings are removed or covered before school please. We are not permitted to apply tape and your child will not be able to take part if their earrings that have not been removed or covered.
