

Worship Theme

In worship we are focusing on Lent.

Lent covers the 40 days ahead of Easter - starting from Ash Wednesday and ending on Holy Saturday — and has become a time when people traditionally give something up.



People give up a different things for Lent, but one of the most popular is chocolate especially for children eyeing up Easter eggs. We are encouraging the children to do something extra for Lent instead of giving something up, like keep their room tidy—ask them what they have decided to do!

But what is Lent and why do people celebrate it? Here is our guide to the Christian tradition:

What is Lent?

In the Christian calendar, Lent is the 40 days leading up to Easter which is treated as a period of reflection and a time for fasting from food and festivities.

It symbolises the days which lead up to Jesus' crucifixion and subsequent resurrection when Christ spent 40 days and nights alone in the desert.

When did Lent start?

Every year Lent starts on Ash Wednesday (the day after Shrove Tuesday) and this year it fell on March 6. Lent finishes on Holy Saturday, the day before Easter Sunday and so this year the end of Lent falls on Saturday April 20.

While Lent is a 40-day period of fasting and prayer, there are 46 days from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday (inclusive).

The reason Lent is 40 days is because 40 is a significant number in Christian scriptures, but the most notable is perhaps that Jesus spent 40 days fasting in the desert in preparation for his ministry.
