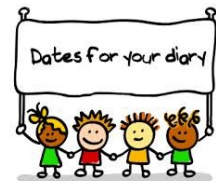

Over the summer holidays, the small car park by school has been converted to a Staff and Deliveries only car park. This is to make our site even safer for our children.

Parents can still use the car park which is a little further up School Road, near the football clubs, or the car park at the other side of the junction with Common Edge Road. We were only able to afford this development because of extra funding we were successful in getting from the diocese, so our thanks go to them for this.

School Playground Gates:

Please remember:

From 3rd September, the playground gates will be opened at 3:25pm and then locked again at 3:45pm. This is to ensure that all children taking part in after school activities are safe on our premises.

If your child is taking part in an activity after school, the leader of that activity will bring the children to the gates at the end of the session and dismiss the children safely to you.

This initiative is run by the Living Streets organisation to encourage sustainable transport to school.
