Our goal is to provide every child with the skills, confidence and motivation to enjoy physical activity both during their time at St Nicholas and throughout their lives.

PE and Sport at St Nicholas

We are committed to providing a wide range of high-quality sporting opportunities for every child, regardless of ability or experience. Throughout the year, pupils take part in curriculum PE, inter-house competitions, festivals, enrichment activities and competitive sport.

Children have opportunities to represent the school in a variety of local and county competitions, including athletics, cross country, rowing, football, netball, cricket, rugby, rounders, boccia, archery, indoor athletics and Quad Kids. We also work closely with local sports clubs and specialist coaches to provide expert coaching in sports such as tennis, rugby and cricket.

Our enrichment programme broadens children's experiences through activities such as sports workshops, visiting athletes, enrichment days, Sports Week, Sports Day and a variety of after-school clubs including football, netball, athletics, cricket, swimming and many more.

By offering a broad and inclusive programme, we aim to inspire every child to find an activity they enjoy, increase participation in physical activity and promote lifelong healthy habits.

The Primary PE and Sport Premium

The Primary PE and Sport Premium is government funding provided to primary schools to improve the quality of PE, physical activity and sport. Schools are expected to use this funding to make sustainable improvements that benefit both current and future pupils.

How we use our Sports Premium funding

At St Nicholas, our Sports Premium funding is carefully planned to ensure it has a lasting impact on the quality of PE and school sport. Funding is used to:

- improve the quality of PE teaching through staff training and high-quality resources;
- increase participation in physical activity and extra-curricular sport;
- provide a wider range of sporting experiences and competitions;
- develop children's confidence, wellbeing and enjoyment of physical activity;

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- ensure all pupils, including those who are disadvantaged or have SEND, have access to inclusive sporting opportunities;
- improve swimming, water safety and outdoor learning opportunities.
