Uniform reminders

Our children wear their uniform with pride, promoting equality and a sense of community. We ask that everyone; children, parents and carers help to ensure that the school dress code is observed.

Children need to wear a white polo shirt, navy cardigan or sweatshirt, grey skirt/pinafore/trousers/shorts.

During the summer term blue and white gingham dresses can be worn. Children may also wear a plain black/navy cap and sunglasses.

Footwear; Black, smart shoes with flat soles. No boots or sandals please. Socks and tights can be navy, black, grey or white.

PE and sports kit (PPA)

When children have PE and Sport (PPA) children need to come to school wearing their kit; White t-shirt, dark blue or black jogging bottoms or leggings (plain), dark blue or black shorts (plain), dark blue or black jumper/hoody and trainers.



Please note; no sport/brand logos on clothing

Please label all items of uniform and belongings clearly to enable lost property to be returned.

We expect hair styles to be smart and not extreme; no bleached, dyed or short shaved hair styles, with no patterns/lines shaved in. Hair that is longer than shoulder length should be worn up, any hair accessories need to be small, navy/black.

We ask that children do not wear temporary tattoos, nail varnish, make up or jewellery, safety studs can be worn for those with pierced ears, for sport /PE/swimming these need to be removed. If this is not possible, please cover with micropore to ensure children's safety.

A watch may be worn to school, due to safeguarding we ask that 'smart' watches are not worn.

PE and sports kit (PPA)

When children have PE and Sport (PPA) children need to come to school wearing their kit;

White t-shirt, dark blue or black jogging bottoms or leggings (plain), dark blue or black shorts (plain), dark blue or black jumper/hoody and trainers.

Please note; no sport/brand logos on clothing



Swimming

On the days that children have a swimming session they come to school dressed in their sports kit. In a separate bag they need a plain swimming costume or lycra trunks and a towel.

Forest school

On the day children have Forest school, Children come to school wearing their kit; dark, plain tracksuit bottoms and a plain long sleeved top with hoody if an extra layer is needed.

A hat, gloves and warm socks are recommended for colder days.

Your children's waterproofs and wellies will already be in school to ensure that they have these for play at break and lunchtime.

Support for parent carers' wellbeing

For any parent with a child who has a Special Educational Need or Disability (SEND), Warwickshire County Council encourages you to apply for a wellbeing assessment as part of the Parent Carer Support Pathway.

The wellbeing conversation is part of the assessment – a practitioner from the Children with Disabilities Team will carry this out with you. This conversation allows us to identify your needs and tailor available support to help you, your child and your wider family members.

The wellbeing conversation may result in signposting to an appropriate local provider. For instance, if you are experiencing physical or mental health needs, a referral can be made to adult services for support in your own right.

The Card enables a disabled cinema guest to receive a complimentary ticket for someone to go with them when they visit a participating cinema.

The Card is also one way for cinemas to make sure they look after their disabled guests. If you require an adjustment to visit a cinema because of your disability, cinema staff should make them for you whether you have a CEA Card or not.



The **Hidden Disabilities Sunflower** is a simple tool for you to voluntarily share that you have a disability or condition that may not be immediately apparent – and that you may need a helping hand, understanding, or more time in shops, at work, on transport, or in public spaces.

The **ILEAP Charity** is for children, young people and adults with Additional Needs and operates in South Warwickshire, although anyone is welcome to join no matter where they live.

ILEAP deliver a user led programme of leisure activities within the local community so that vulnerable people can access leisure provision in a safe and supported way.

It costs £12 per year to join the ILEAP Charity.

Emotional Based Schol Avoidance

Do you have a child or young person who has been off school for a prolonged period, due to emotional and/or physical distress, such as anxiety?

Warwickshire Parent Carer Voice is working with Warwickshire County Council to run two parent and carer focus groups to look at the current support for children and young people, and their families, experiencing Emotionally Based School Avoidance (EBSA) and would like your feedback. You may also have heard this being referred to as 'attendance difficulties' or 'school refusal'.

By attending one of the focus groups, you will be helping the council to understand your experiences and how they can improve support for children and young people with attendance difficulties.

The two focus groups will take place on:

Places will be limited to help keep the discussion focussed. Parents and carers will be asked to share their own experiences in response to a specific set of questions.

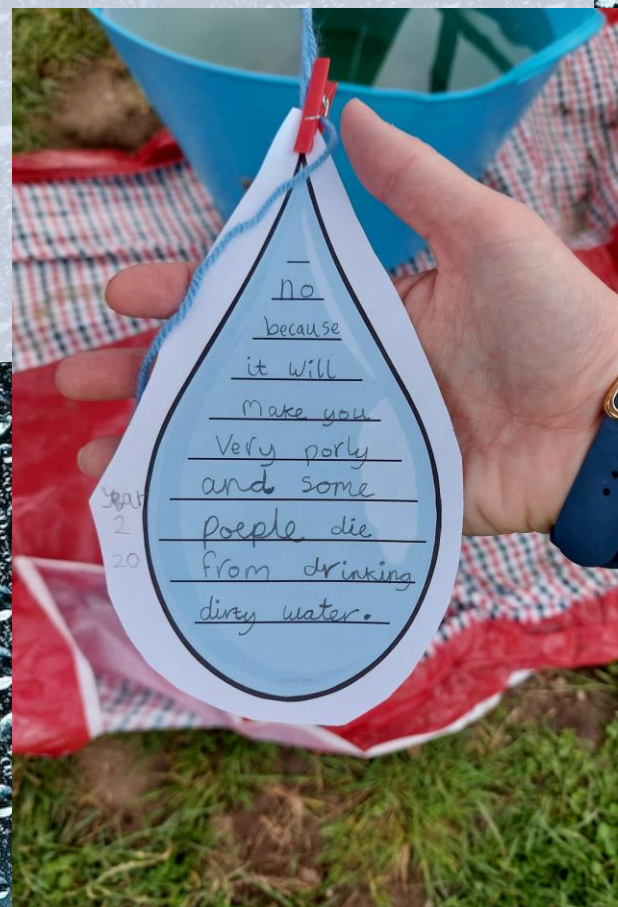
Whole school Water Walk

On Tuesday 18th July, the children took action for social injustice by taking part in a water walk to the River Arrow. The whole school walked to the shingle beach by the weir to collect water in a bucket and return it to school. They did this to reflect on the journey that many children have to make every day to get water- often not even clean water.

“Clean water for everyone everywhere” is the WaterAid cause that the children voted for and feel passionately about. They wanted to do something that not only raised money, but raised awareness and understanding of what some children must do to have access to a water supply.

Thank you to our families for supporting the event by making £1 donations to twin a toilet in the school with an overseas toilet. Toilet Twinning is a charity that will use our donation to supply sustainable resources for families overseas to build their own toilets and provide education about good hygiene. The school raised enough money to twin 2 of their toilets!

The event was a great success and the children look forward to continuing their mission to speak up and take action on issues of social injustice in the new academic year.



Courageous Advocacy

Summer Soiree

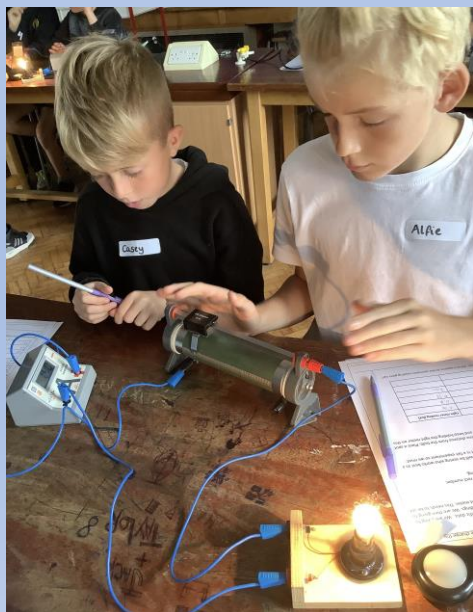

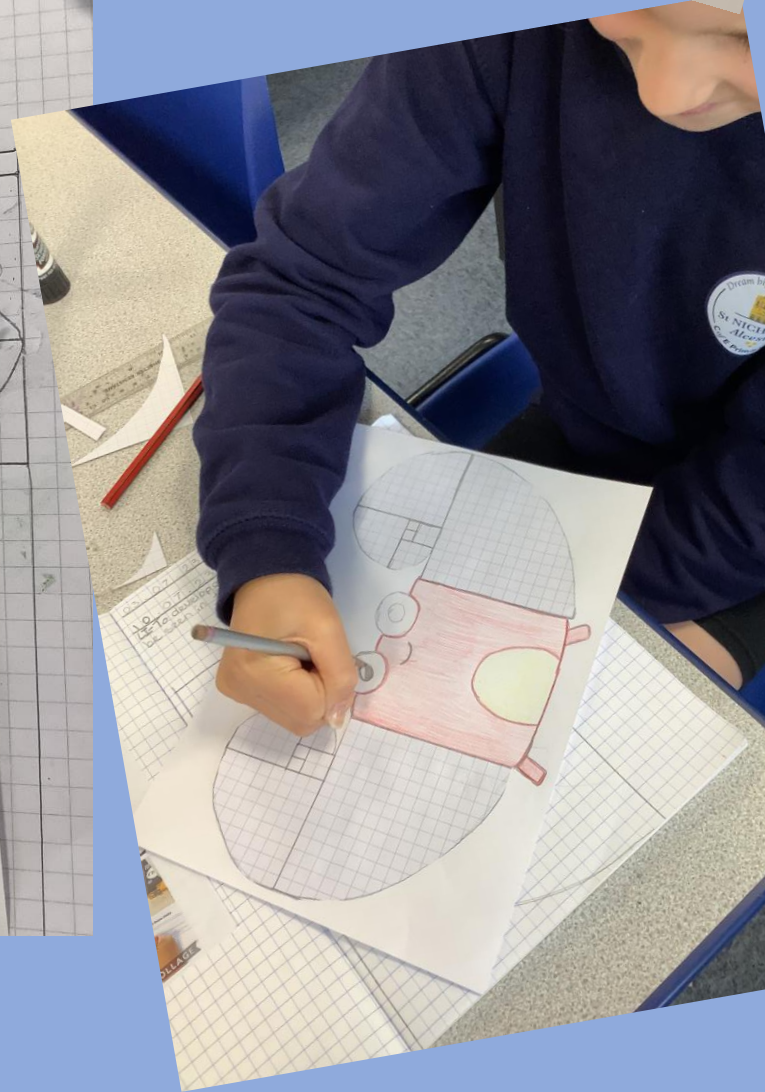
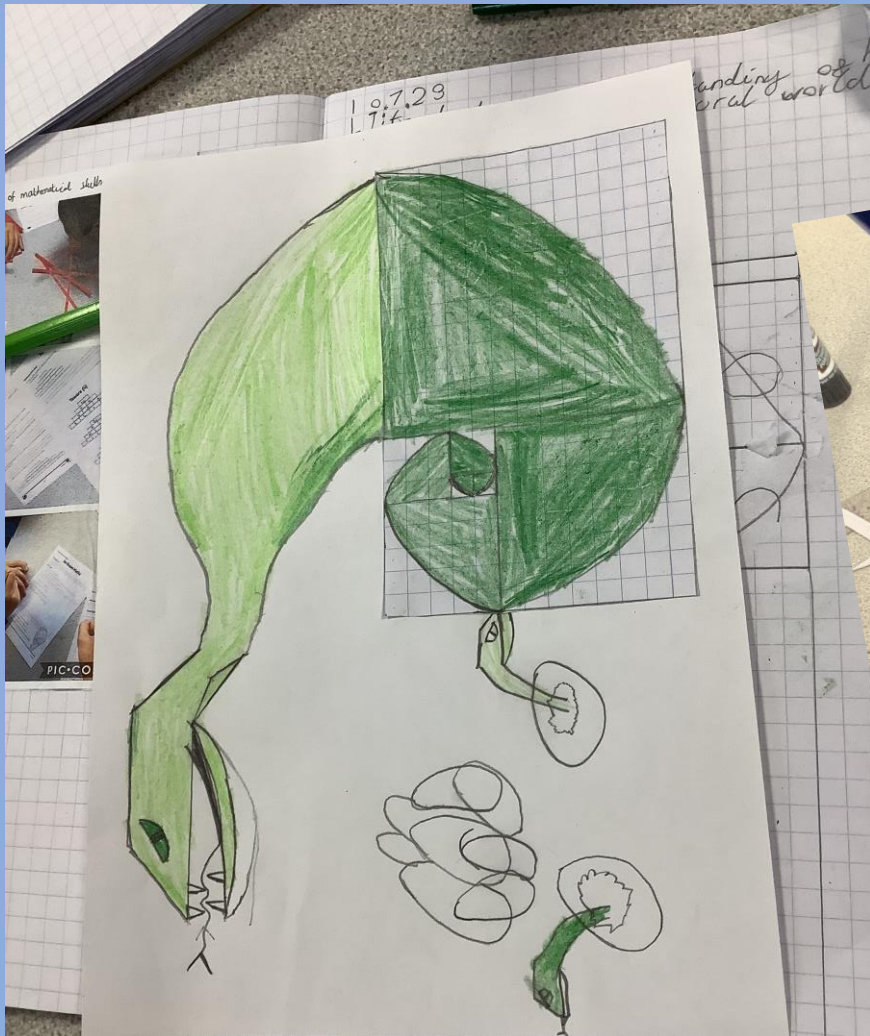
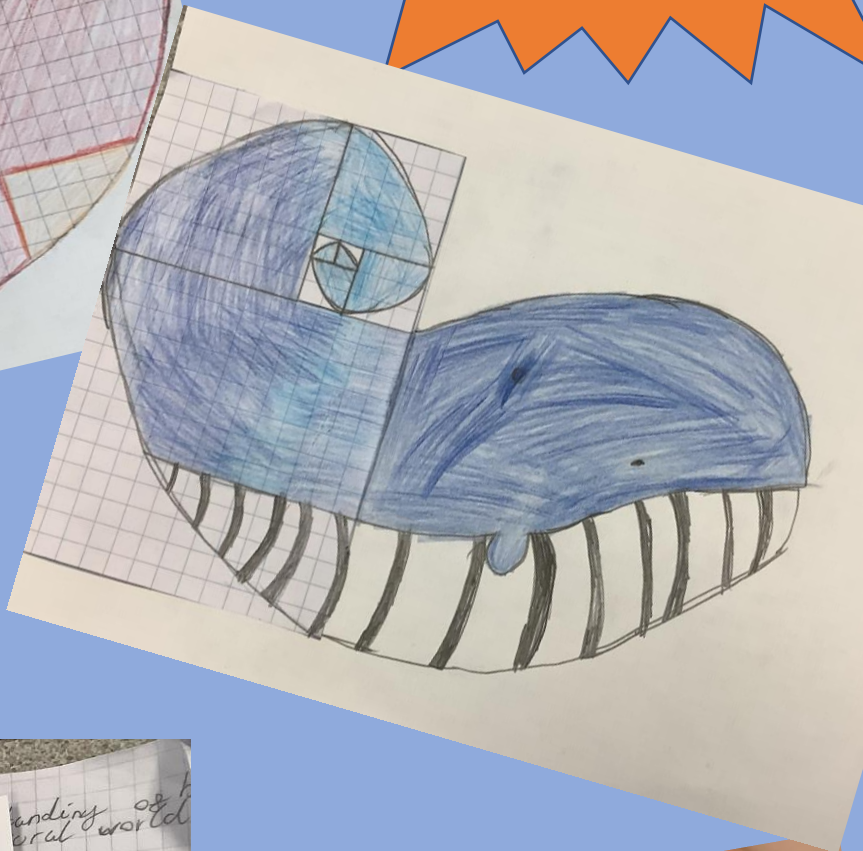
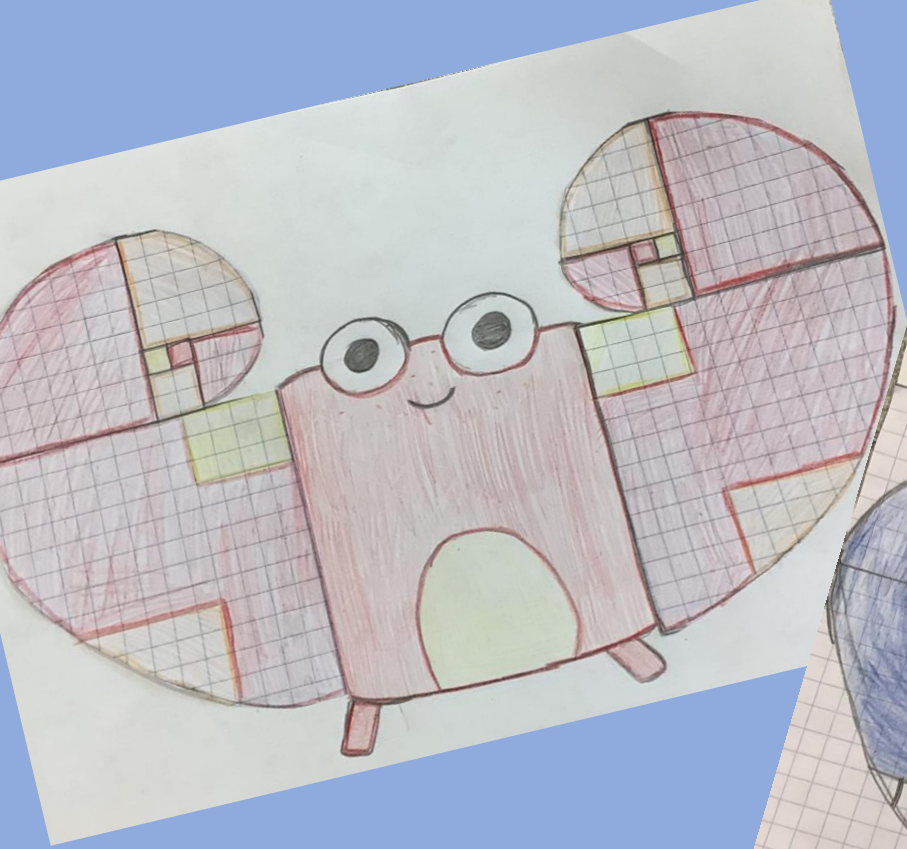
2W and 4K

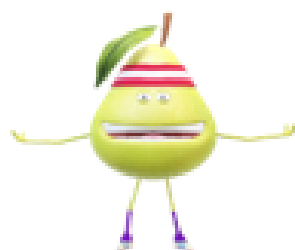
