

Blackbirds have been enjoying reading the book FArTHER by Graham Baker-Smith. The story is about a young boy who is fascinated by his father's dream of flying. The boy's father is consumed by his passion to fly and the son is caught up in his father's dream. When the father goes to war and does not return it seems like the dream has gone with him.

Much later, when the boy has a son of his own, he himself develops the dream of flying and begins to invent his own flying machine.
